Copy of Contract

This agreement made and entered into
this First day of January, A. D. 1889
by and between the City of Concordia,
in the County of Cloud and State of Kansas,
party of the First part and the Missouri
Pacific Railway Company, a corporation
of the States of Missouri and Kansas, doing
business also at the said city
party of the Second part

Witnesseth:—That the said party of the first
part hereby covenants and agrees to furnish
the said party of the second part for the
consideration hereinafter mentioned with
water from their system of water works now
in operation for its use in water tank or in
stand pipe or any other arrangements provided
by said second party, for any and all
purposes for which the party of the second
party may require water in the said city
of Concordia, in sufficient quantities
at all times and seasons, for the use of the
Central Branch of the Union Pacific Railway
barring accidents or intervention of
Providence for the full period and term of Ten
years from and after the First day of
January, 1889 said water to be delivered
at any point in the mains of said party

of the first Part now laid in the city aforesaid or which hereafter may be laid near the line or right of way of the Central Branch Railway

The said Party of the Second Part in Consideration of such Supply of water for the period and time mentioned above, will pay to the said party of the First Part at the rate of Eight Cents (0.08) per one thousand Gallons for all water delivered which Supply is to be determined by meter measurement: payments to be made monthly at such time in each month as payment are usually made by said Railway Company the first payment to be made in the month of February 1889 for all water taken prior to February First 1889 and subsequent payment regularly each month thereafter for such amount of water as may have been delivered.

It is further agreed and understood by and between the Parties hereto that the said first Party will at its own cost and expense lay and maintain water pipes near to the place or places where the water is utilized and up to the right of way or boundary line of the land owned by the said Central Branch Railway at which point the said Second party will make connection, lay water pipes at its own expense and maintain the same. The said Second Party further agrees to furnish, put in place and maintain one three inch or more meter, and if found necessary an additional meter. Said meters to be accessible to both Parties of this agreement all water shall be delivered through and registered by said meter or meters and the quantity registered to be considered correct.

 dry well is the one next to it most of the
 other eight wells appear to be furnishing
 a fair amount of water and your

Committee believes this to be the case and that others only a small amount, your Committee is of the opinion that the full capacity of the well is equal only to one fifth of the capacity of the pumps or about 200,000 gallons a day of 24 hours this makes the expense of pumping about four times what it would be if the wells offered a volume of water equal to the capacity of the pumps which is one million gallons per day. The Committee is of the opinion that smaller pipes for the wells than those in use which have a diameter of six inches, would do as well or better than three inches and possibly two (2) inch pipes would do as well as these and the cost would be greatly reduced by using such pipes in future wells new wells are needed and must be had to enable the city to supply the patrons of the water works with water.

Your Committee made the discovery that the first vein of water is being drawn upon and contributes the water supply.

Your Committee is not agreed as to whether the system should be extended by sinking more wells, a majority favoring this and the other members opposing it.

8. Messages and appointments by the Mayor.
9. Unfinished business.
10. Business on the table in the order in which it was placed there.
11. Consideration of ordinances reported by committees.
12. Consideration of bills reported by the Finance committee.
13. When the council shall resume its sitting after adjournment it shall proceed to unfinished business unless otherwise determined by a two thirds vote.
14. The ayes and nays shall be ordered on the call of any councilman.
15. Councilmen shall be entitled to five minutes in which to explain his vote, in his own way, when his name is called.

16. The rules of proceeding and debate in deliberative assemblies as laid down in Cushing's Manual is adopted for the use of this body where the same are applicable and not in conflict with the foregoing rules or others that may be adopted.

17. It is the duty of the Finance committee to examine and report upon all bills for the payment of money.

18. It shall be the duty of the committee of Ways and Means to take into consideration all such reports of the Treasurer, and all such propositions relative to the revenues as may be referred to it by the Council; to inquire into the state of the City debt, or the revenue, and of the expenditures, and to report from time to time its opinion thereon; to examine into the state of the several public departments, particularly those relating to the appropriation of moneys and and to report whether the moneys have been disbursed conformably to law; also to report, from time to time, such provisions and arrangements as may be necessary to add to the economy of the departments, and the accountability of the officers. It is made the duty, also, of the committee to report, at the regular meeting in September of each year the amount of money to be raised for general and other expenses, by taxation and otherwise, specifying the sum needed in each department.

Ordinance No 289.

All Ordinance to suppress Lewdness

Be It ordained by the Mayor and City Councilmen
of the City of Concordia.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any female person
to be, or become an inmate of any house of ill-
fame, Bawdy-House, brothel or House of prostitution,
or for the purpose of prostitution or of illicit sexual
intercourse, or to be found in, resort to or frequent
any building, house, room, or place kept, conducted,
occupied, used or maintained for the purpose
of prostitution, or as a place of assignation
for illicit sexual intercourse.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any male
person to be found in, visit, resort to or frequent
any house of ill fame, bawdy house, brothel or house
of prostitution, or any house, building room or place
kept, conducted, occupied, used or maintained
for the purpose of prostitution, or as a place of
assignation for illicit sexual intercourse.

Section three. It shall be unlawful for any
male person to live, room or habitually associate
with any female or females who keep conduct-
or maintain, or who are inmates of, or who,
for the purpose of prostitution frequent any
house, room, building or place kept, con-
ducted, occupied used or maintained for
the purpose of prostitution.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any
person. by words, action, signs or any
means whatever, to solicit, entice or attempt
to entice any person for the purpose of
prostitution, or illicit sexual intercourse.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any
town

person to have illicit sexual intercourse.
 Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to aid, abet, assist or procure any person or persons to do any of the things which are declared to be unlawful by the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 7. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before the Police Court shall be fined in a sum not exceeding One hundred dollars.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Concordia Blade.



Every person who shall place, or permit to remain on any premises in the city of Concordia, of which he has the control as owner, agent, lessee, occupant or otherwise, any filth, garbage, offal excrement, decaying animal or vegetable matter so as to cause any foul, offensive or unhealthy smell in the vicinity to the annoyance of any person or persons or to the public, or who shall upon any premises under his control as aforesaid make, permit to be made or remain any excavations wherein water is collected and permitted to remain and become stagnant so as to cause any foul, offensive or unhealthy smell in the vicinity, or to contaminate wells in the vicinity or to become otherwise offensive or unwholesome, or dangerous to health, to the annoyance of any person or persons, or to the public, or who shall engage in or carry on any business or occupation on any premises in said city under his control as aforesaid, in a manner whereby any noxious, unwholesome or offensive stench or vapor is produced or generated in the vicinity to the annoyance of any person, persons or the public, or who shall use, maintain, or permit to remain on any premises under his control as aforesaid, any pen or enclosure in which cattle, hogs or other animals are

kept in such a manner as to become offensive or annoying to those in the vicinity or to the public, by reason of foul, unwholesome or unhealthy odors thereby produced, or by reason of disturbing noises thereby caused, shall be deemed guilty of maintaining a nuisance, and upon conviction thereof before the police court shall be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. Whenever any person shall have been convicted of any violation of any of the provisions of the preceding section, it shall be the duty of the city marshal forthwith to abate the nuisance for maintaining which said person was convicted, and the person so convicted shall be liable to the city of Concordia for all expenses of such abatement to be recovered in an action before any court of competent jurisdiction with costs thereof.

SECTION 3. Nothing herein shall be construed or held to limit or effect, or in anywise be limited or effected by the powers and duties of the Board of Health as heretofore defined by the ordinance of the city.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city paper.

PETITION.

When said The Omaha, Kansas and Southern Railway Company shall have constructed the said line of railroad, from some point on the south line of said County of Cloud into said city of Concordia, and to the point hereinafter stated, with said track, a switch and passenger and freight depot as before set forth, and have the cars running thereon within the time above stated, then the Mayor and Councilmen of the city of Concordia shall issue to said The Omaha, Kansas & Southern Railway Company said twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) of bonds, said bonds to be issued in sums of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) each payable in thirty (30) years from date issued, bearing six per cent interest payable semi-annually, both principal and interest payable to the fiscal agent of the state of Kansas at New York City.

And we pray said Mayor and Councilmen upon presentation of this petition, duly sworn and made an order, which order shall embrace the terms and conditions of this petition and such other conditions as the Mayor and Councilmen deem it advisable to make fixing the time for holding said special election, which we pray may be held as by law provided under chapter 67, laws of Kansas, 1893, and determine whether such bonds shall be issued, and the form of the ballot to be used at said special election for and against said proposition, so submitted, shall be as follows: Each qualified voter voting for said proposition shall have printed or written on the ballot "For the Bonds." Each qualified voter voting against said proposition shall have printed or written on his ballot "Against the Bonds." And whereas the said petition having been duly filed and set down for hearing and the

Mayor and Councilmen having duly examined and considered the same, and being fully advised in the premises, do set and declare that the said petition is in writing and that it is signed by more than two-fifths of the resident tax payers of said city of Concordia that it desires that The Omaha, Kansas & Southern Railway Company be authorized to extend aid by the issuance of bonds to aid said railroad to defray the expenses of securing and paying for land for right-of-way, depot grounds and terminal facilities, and the amount of bonds to be issued and issued by said city. That it sets forth the manner and amounts of said bonds, when and when payable, the time to run, and the interest thereon, and the other conditions necessary thereto; also the form of the ballots to be used at such election to be ordered for and against the issuance of said bonds, and the petition is in all respects in conformity to law.

That a special election be, and the same is hereby ordered to take place in the city of Concordia, Kansas, on the 1st day of September, 1903, at which said election there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said city, for their acceptance or rejection the following proposition: That the city of Concordia, in the County of Cloud, and state of Kansas, issue its bonds to the amount of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) in amounts of five hundred dollars each, to aid The Omaha, Kansas & Southern Railway Company or better, for the thirty years from date of issue, bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually with interest coupons attached, both principal and interest payable to the fiscal agency of the state of Kansas at New York City, said bonds to be issued on the following condition, viz: so soon as said proposition shall be determined in the affirmative, by a canvass of the vote cast at such election, and so soon as the said The Omaha, Kansas & Southern Railway Company shall have constructed said railroad, standard gauge including all necessary side-tracks and switches from some point in Saline County, Kansas, and some point on the same line of said County of Cloud to a point within the corporation limits of said city of Concordia, and shall have constructed suitable passenger and freight depot within said city, and shall have the cars running on said railroad ready for business, then said Mayor and Council of said city shall cause such bonds with coupons attached, as aforesaid to be issued in the name of said city of Concordia, Kansas, and shall deliver the same to said railroad company.
