

Regular Session, Jan. 4, 1909.

Council met in regular session with Mayor Whipp presiding and councilmen as follows:

Fell, Cline, Thompson, Baker, Foster, Scott & Rigby.

Minutes of the last regular session, of the adjourned session and the several special sessions were then read and approved as read.

Dr. Chas. Caton, Pres. of the Board of Education appeared before the council and asked that the public schools be granted the free use of the water used from the city mains.

The matter was deferred until later in the evening.

Mr. C. E. Sweet appeared before the council and asked that the ordinance relating to the parking on Broadway north of Eleventh street be amended so as to make the street wider at that place on account of the large amount of water passing down the street during floods.

Matter was referred to Parking committee. Mr. Sweet also asked the permission of the council for the M. E. Church to be allowed to put in "anti-freeze" water closets, stating that the ordinance relating to sewer connections would not permit it.

Matter was deferred to be taken up later in the evening.

Mr. Kennedy, foreman of the S. W. Bridge Co., the firm erecting the standpipe, appeared before the council and asked that his company be permitted to not put in the expansion joint on the supply pipe as it enters the standpipe he making several statements regarding the same, and after several arguments on the subject and communications from Burns & McDonnell being read the council agreed to meet at the standpipe in the morning and look over the situation before making any decision on the matter.

Reports of committees were then called for and Chairman Fell of the Waterworks committee read a report from Burns & McDonnell relating to the recent inspection of the extensions and improvements and the committee recommended that a concrete, hollow wall

house be built to put the registering device of the large meter into and that trees and grass be planted around the plant after the grounds have been graded so as to beautify the grounds.

Upon motion the recommendations of the committee were adopted and they were given power to act regarding the same and the report of Burns & McDonnell was ordered placed on file.

The proposition of F.A. Stilson that was submitted to the council at the last regular meeting and referred to the special river com. was not acted on by the committee but it referred back the matter to the Council and after discussion the proposition was rejected.

The permission asked by the M.E. Church trustees to place inside their building anti-freezing water closets was then taken up for discussion and the ordinance relating to sewer connections was read and it was moved and seconded that it be the sense of this council that the closets to be used do not come under the restrictions of the ordinance - Motion passed.

The request of the Board of Education relating to the free use of water for the Public schools was then discussed and on a motion being seconded and passed request was refused.

The M.E. Church being through with their building and having their water supply metered the city engineer was instructed to read their meter and charge them for water used above the amount of 1000 cubic feet per quarter after this date. City Engineer also instructed to shut off the water on the tap that is not used.

Reports of Police Judge, City Clerk, and Street Commissioner were read, approved and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the city engineer relating to having 13th street near the City Park made 40 feet wide where it is adjacent to the Nazareth Academy grounds was read and ordered filed and the matter referred to St. & Alley Com.

The committee on fire department, through Mr. Clive, recommended the installation of an electric apparatus for ringing the fire bell, to be controlled from telephone central, and that the electric light co. be requested to turn on all street lights when a fire occurs after midnight or on nights when they are off under the moonlight schedule.

The recommendations were referred to the committee to inquire into the cost, a report to be made next meeting.

The following additional fire department officers were appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council.

W. E. Hinkle foreman Hook & Ladder Comp. No. 1, H. Schroof foreman Chemical Engine, Frank Scott foreman Hose Cart No. 1, J. Sanger foreman Hose Cart No. 2.

Chief Murray was instructed to fill company and report to the Mayor and Council for confirmation.

Mr. J. D. Fall ^{reported} that when the standpipe was filled to about the 7 or 8 ring still leaked. He also reported favorable on the building of a house for the water register later on when the weather was more favorable for the work.

The committee on public improvements was instructed to continue to act on Ladies rest room proposition and if plan could be devised to aid the scheme.

The park committee was given more time to report on the parking in front of the Carnegie library.

The city engineer was instructed to make a survey and present a profile to the Council for grade on Olive street.

Mr Olive of the Fire Department committee reported that he had communicated to a company in regards to the fire alarm the company he said was to send a representative but had failed to do so. and the committee was granted more time to report.

Mr. Truitt of the Street and alley committee reported findings on 13th Street showing the present lines as owned by the academy. a motion ^{made} was ^{and} seconded and motion carried that the report be referred back to the committee.

Mr. Bigby of the Ordinances committee reported an Ordinance relative to the establishing of a grade on State Street from 6th to 11th street. after some discussion it was referred to the street and alley committee and City Engineer for investigation.

The Olive Street Ordinance was referred back to the street and alley committee for investigation. on motion being ^{made} ^{and} seconded and carried.

Mr. Bell read a communication from Mr. Burns as regards to his findings as to the conditions of the standpipe and could see no reason why it could not be completed as per conditions of the contract.

Mr. Bell stated that the Southwestern Bridge Co. had sent an expert to see what could be done and are now at work.

He also stated that the city was protected by a surety bond to more than offset the amount already paid and that the city could lose nothing on the standpipe.

The bond of the Concordia Electric Light Co. was called to the attention of the council by Mr. Bell.
