Mayor Kenneth appointed H.A. Linder Street Commissioner and on Motion the appointment was confirmed by the Council.

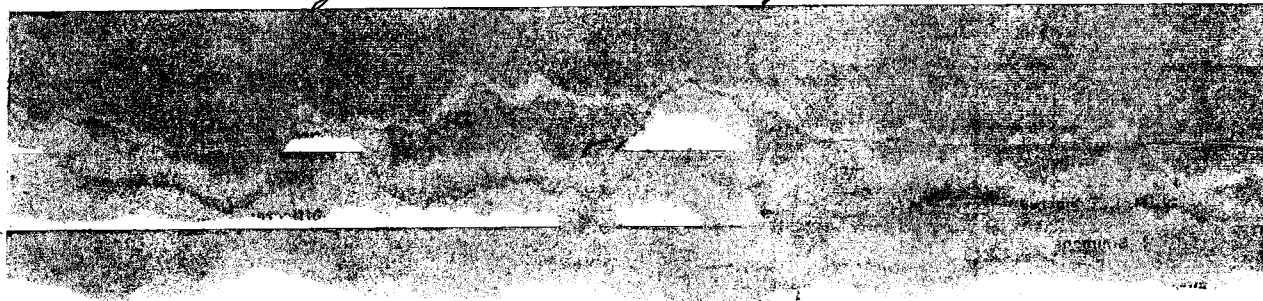

Rules and regulations of city
meetings

Resolved, by the Councilmen of the City of Concordia, that the following rules and order of business for the government of the deliberations of the City Council be and the same are hereby adopted, as follows:

Rule 1. The regular meetings of the Council shall be held on the first Monday of each month at eight P. M.

Rule 2. The Mayor will take the chair at the hour appointed for the meeting of the Council and if a quorum be present business shall proceed.

Rule 4. Calling the roll.

Rule 5. Reading of the Journal of last meeting.

Rule 3. In the absence of the Mayor the President of the Council shall preside, and in the absence of the Mayor and President, the Council shall select one of their own number to act as President pro tem. The presiding officer shall be addressed as "Mr. President".

Rule 6. Call for petitions by wards in regular order commencing with ward one. All petitions shall be referred to the committee having the subject matter in charge.

Rule 7. Reports of standing committees and disposals of the same shall be called in the order in which they are created.

Rule 8. Reports from select committees. If reports of committees are not disposed of before the Council proceeds to attend to other business the Mayor shall resume the next call where he left off.

Rule 9. Resolutions shall next be called for and disposed of by the rules applied to petitions.

Rule 10. No more than one hour shall be occupied with petitions, resolutions and reports of committees unless otherwise ordered by the Council.

Rule 11. Messages and appointments by the Mayor.

Rule 12. Unfinished business.

Rule 13. Business on the table in the order in which it was placed there.

Rule 14. Consideration of ordinances reported by the ordinance committee.

Rule 15. Consideration of bills reported by the Ways, Means and Finance Committee.

Rule 16. When the Council shall resume its sitting after adjournment it shall proceed to unfinished business unless otherwise determined by a two thirds vote.

Rule 17. The ayes and nays shall be ordered on the call of any Councilman.

Rule 18. Councilmen shall be entitled to five minutes in which to explain his vote, in his own way, when his name is called.

Rule 19. It is the duty of the Ways, Means, and Finance committee to

examine and report upon all bills for the payment of money.

Rule 20. It shall be the duty of the Ways, Means and Finance committee to take into consideration all such reports of the Treasurer, and all such propositions relative to the revenues ~~as may~~ as may be referred to it by the Council; to inquire into the state of the City debt, or the revenue, and of the expenditures, and to report from time to time its opinion thereon; to examine into the state of the several public departments particularly those relating to the ap-pro-priation of moneys and to report whether the moneys have been disbursed conformably to law; also to report from time to time, such provisions and arrangements as may be necessary to add to the economy of the departments, and the accountability of the officers. It is made the duty, also, of the committee to report at the second regular meeting in August of each year the amount of money to be raised for general and other expenses, by taxation and otherwise, specifying the sum needed in each department.

Rule 21. No member shall speak to another or otherwise interrupt the business of the Council, while the minutes or other public papers are being read.

Rule 22. Every member rising to debate, present a petition or other paper, to give a notice, make a report or motion, shall address the Presiding officer and shall not proceed until recognized by him.

Rule 23. When two or more members rise at the same time, the Presiding officer is to name the member who is entitled to the floor.

Rule 24. When a member shall be called to order, shall sit down until the Presiding officer shall have determined whether he was in order or not, and every question of order may be debatable by consent of two thirds of the members present, and shall be decided by the Presiding officer, subject to an appeal to the Council by any member.

Rule 25. A majority of all the members elect shall constitute a quorum.

Rule 26. The Mayor, or President, when presiding, shall have a right to name any member to perform the duties of presiding officer, who is thereby ~~invested~~ vested during such time with all the powers of such presiding officer but such substitute shall not lose the privilege of voting on any question while so presiding, nor shall his power as such a substitute continue beyond an adjournment.

Rule 27. All motions shall be reduced to writing if desired by the Presiding officer or any member, and read by the presiding officer or clerk, before the same shall be debated; but every such motion may be withdrawn at any time before amendment or decision by consent of the Council.

Rule 28: All standing committees shall consist of four members and shall be named by the Mayor at the first regular meeting in May of each year and confirmed by the Council.

Rule 29. The following are the standing committees of the Council.

Ways, Means and Finance.

Streets and Alleys.

Waterworks and Sewerage.

Police, Fire and License.

Municipal Lights.

Public Buildings.

Parks and Cemetery.

Rule 30. The question on the passage of all ordinances shall be taken by the ayes and noes, which shall, be entered on the minutes.

Rule 31. All questions relating to the priority of business shall be decided by the presiding officer.

Rule 32. If the question under consideration contains several points, any member may have the same divided.

Rule 33. When a question is under consideration no motion shall be in ~~rule~~ order except to adjourn, to lie on the table, to postpone indefinitely, to postpone until next meeting, to commit, to amend, which several motions shall have precedence in the order herein named, and the first two shall be decided without debate.

Rule 34. When a blank is to be filled, and different sums or times shall be proposed, the question shall first be taken upon the highest sum and longest time.

Rule 35. When a question has been once put and decided it shall be in order for any member to move a reconsideration thereof, but said motion to be in order must not be made later than the next meeting of the Council.

Rule 36. The Mayor, and Council shall, at the request of either the Mayor or any member of the council, go into executive session, and all persons, excepting the clerk and such other officers and persons as may be desired to attend, shall be excluded from the room. All remarks and proceedings during executive session shall be kept secret, and the clerk shall enter upon the Journal such record as shall recite the result of the proceedings had in executive session as ~~indicated~~ shall be indicated by resolution of the council.

Rule 37. On forming a committee of the whole council, the chairman shall leave the chair and call some member to preside.

Rule 38. The rules of the council shall be observed in committee of the whole so far as they are applicable. Neither the previous question or motion to adjourn, shall be put in committee of the whole.

Rule 39. A motion that the committee rise shall always be in order and shall be decided without debate.

Rule 40. The clerk shall only enter upon the records such proceedings of the committee of the whole as may be reported to the council, by the chairman of the committee, which report shall be made immediately upon the rising of the committee.

Rule 41. It shall be the duty of the chairman of each committee and all

Rule 42. All committees other than standing committees, shall be appointed by the presiding officer, unless otherwise ordered by the council.
