Council met with Mayor Short presiding. Councilmen present. Ossmann, Stewart, Everitt, Right, and Swartz. Mr. Sullivan representative of the Anderson Coupling Fire supply Co. of Kansas City Kansas, was present, and was called to explain his proposition to the Council, in regard to a fire wagon. Mr. Sullivan first stated that he had a good proposition to offer the Council in a good 2nd hand but almost new Combination Fire wagon Equipped with Chemical Tank and all other necessary apparatus including hose ladders, everything complete with a good trained team of horses weighing from 1350 to 1450# with a good set of fire harness complete for the sum of \$1400. or the wagon without horses & harness for \$900, after due consideration the Council considered a proposition of a new Combination wagon only with all its apparatus. With Mr. Sullivan recommended very highly at the price of \$1050, with the understanding to sign a contract with the City that at any time the City might wish in 3 or 5 years the Company would agree to take the wagon in exchange for an other wagon or a motor car at 5% less per year of price paid for said wagon.
