

## REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 7, 1918.

COUNCIL MET IN REGULAR SESSION Mayor Millirons presiding and the following Councilmen present: HUSCHER, DIEBEL, NEITZEL, IJAMS, RIGBY.

WM. FRANCOEUR APPEARED BEFORE THE COUNCIL asking a settlement on the work done on the pump house.

MOVED SECONDED AND CARRIED THAT THE MATTER of changes in the building to conform to the contract be referred back to the Engineer in charge for final settlement with Mr. Francoeur.

MR. FRANCOEUR THEN ASKED the Council to do something further towards the payment for the sewer and paving in blocks 131 and 132, however the City can do nothing further in this matter until the work is acceptable to the Engineer appointed to take charge of this job, owing to the final payment, which is to be made by the issue of Bonds

MOVED SECONDED AND CARRIED THAT A communication from the Central National Bank Topeka regarding the loss of a coupon No. 3 on bond No. 28 \$12.50, was referred to the City Attorney for his opinion.

MOVED SECONDED AND CARRIED THAT BLACK & VEATCH be requested to straighten up the records on the paving, as checked up by the Audit people.

MOVED SECONDED AND CARRIED THAT THE CITY ATTORNEY be instructed to draw up an ordinance for Plumbers making it an offense to take out a meter and keep it out indefinitely and not notify the Water Commissioner.

THE POLICE JUDGES REPORT was read, ordered received and placed on file.

THE TREASURERS REPORT was read, and ordered referred to the Chairman of the Ways & Means Committee, and Clerk for checking up of some of the balances.

MOVED SECONDED AND THE FOLLOWING VOTE ON ROLL CALL decided the fate of the resolution of Mr. Rigby in regard to willful lying, by word of mouth or in the paper. AYE. RIGBY, DIEBEL. NO. HUSCHER, NEITZEL, IJAMS.

MR. PATTERSON APPEARED BEFORE THE Council asking that he be not charged the two minimums on one hydrant furnishing two houses with water. This question concerns the new Water Ordinance and was laid over to the next meeting of the Council.

MR. DOSTER PRESENTED THE claim of Mrs. Marquans for water run through the Meter at her property, owing to a large leak on the property. This being no fault of the City and was handled as other claims, where the Meter is tested and found correct.

MOVED SECONDED AND THE following vote on roll call on a motion by Councilman Rigby that the Cloud County Chamber of Commerce and the Farm Bureau be charged \$15.00 monthly for the room occupied, in the City Hall. AYE. IJAMS, RIGBY, NEITZEL. NO. HUSCHER, DIEBEL. Mayor claimed motion lost but Councilman Rigby claimed it carried by a majority of the vote present. Rigby Referred to the City Attorney for settlement.

MR. MC CONAHEY APPEARED BEFORE THE COUNCIL to ask for a reduction of the water rent at the Allen property 408 E. 8th Street. On motion seconded and carried, the meter being correct, the reading was approved as made.

ON MOTION SECONDED AND CARRIED the water rent of A. H. Bolinger for Sept. 1916 was made to stand as read, the water commissioner reporting the meter reading as correct.


