The members of the City Council in their assembling again are saddened by the absence from their midst of one whom death has taken. Fred W. Sturges Jr., died at his home in Concordia, Sunday August 22th, 1920, following a comparatively short illness. A man of brilliant intellect, and fine personal appearance, he was born March 20th, 1869 in Red Wing, Minn, coming to Concordia, with his parents at the early age of two years.
He has since made this his home, growing into manhood, a part of the town's best development, a factor in each civic improvement.

The usual mental endowments which were his, were developed by a liberal education, he after completing his course in our city schools having attended St. Johns Academy at Salina, and the University of Minn, and being associated while little more than a youth in the law practice of his father, Judge F.W. Sturges Sr.

Standing always for these principles which he believed to be essential to the highest well being of his town and state and with a far sighted clearness of vision he was an early exponent of the manifold advantages of temperance, at a time when that cause had not attained the popularity it enjoys to-day.

Bred in his interests, an active participant in all community movements and enterprises, he was a member of the Masons, Moose, Elks and Maccabees.

Vitally alive to the big issues of the day and hour, he was always a vigorous champion of the tenets of the Republican party, for a number of years previous to the time of his death being chairman of the Republican County Central Committee.

He was ardent and infatigable worker for the cause, and known as one of the most able Republican in the Fifth District, besides being actively engaged in the practice of law.

Mr Sturges has held many county and city offices, being County Attorney for some terms and at the time of his death being City Attorney.

It would be impossible to give a comprehensive account of the development of Concordia, and Cloud County without including in it the important part that has been due to the efforts of Mr Sturges.

Always a leader in rousing civic sentiment to the co-operative support of home industries and institutions, no citizens has been more untiring than he, in his endeavors to promote conditions which would operate for the growth and betterment of Concordia.

Brilliant in intellect, gifted with judgement, discrimination and vision; possessed of unusual power and ability as an orator, he was ever modest of his own accomplishments and absolutely devoid of any trace of egotism.

Unusually handsome and distinguished in appearance, infallibly immaculate and well groomed, his bearing was invariably that of the man who is a gentleman by birth, home training and intellectual attainments.

He was married in 1897 to Miss Katherine Grosbeck, who with their three children Russel G., Fred W. third Katherine A., survive him.

He also leaves a brother, a sister and his father with whom he practiced law in partnership for many years and to whom the loss of his companionship and devoted thoughtfulness will be an ever deepening grief.

An exemplary husband, a kind indulgent father, an affectionate and devoted son, an upright and public spirited citizen, - such was the man whose loss the entire community mourns.
