Therefore.we recommend that the footpieces in wells 1 and 2 be raised 20' feet in each well, and provisions be made for their easy starting. It is understood this should be considered a temporary measure only. Later when wells 3.4.5.and 6 shall have been developed to a point of maximum yeild, the plant should be gone over and all wells properly balanced.
