Council met in special Session as prescribed by law for the purpose of canvassing the vote cast at the special election held in the City of Concordia, Kansas, on Tuesday Jan. 19th 1926.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING BE ADOPTED? Shall the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Concordia, be authorized and instructed to purchase land without the limits of said City commonly known as the Fair Grounds being the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 34, Township 5, Range 3 West in Cloud County, Kansas, to be used as a public Park and to establish and maintain thereon a Park for the use and benefit of the people of said City and to issue bonds of said city in a sum not exceeding \$ 10,000 as provided by law, to pay for the purchase thereof.

That confirming verbal report today we find the pumping conditions in your wells are making it necessary to carry an air pressure higher than should be maintained by the machines.

This is due to the fact that the water at present stands higher, when pumping, in wells number 1 and 2 than in the other four.

There are two solutions. One is to repipe wells 1 and 2 with larger size so as to draw the water level lower and thus reduce the operating pressure. The other is to raise the air lift devices, or foot pieces, in wells 1 and 2 thus reducing the necessary operating pressure at these wells.

The first solution would be the proper one but for the fact that the other four wells will undoubtedly develop to a point where the water level will stand higher. If and when this occurs the plant would be out of balance again and the pipe in wells 1 and 2 would need changing, again.

Therefore, we recommend that the footpieces in wells 1 and 2 be raised 20' feet in each well, and provisions be made for their easy starting. It is understood this should be considered a temporary measure only. Later when wells 3,4,5, and 6 shall have been developed to a point of maximum yield, the plant should be gone over and all wells properly balanced. Advise on what should be done at this time, will be furnished by the Sullivan Machinery Co without charge this being ~~xxxx~~ the usual service with us.
