It is further agreed that for the purpose of ball playing the second party is to have the sole and exclusive right to said grounds during the period of this lease, and is to have the right to exclude any and all other teams from using said grounds for such purposes, one of the considerations for this provision that the second party is to keep the grounds and base ball diamond in shape for such games as they chose to have at their own expense.

It is further agreed that the Concordia Base Ball Club, the second party, shall have the exclusive right to the base ball diamond, or the ground upon which the diamond is situated on Sundays from ten o clock in the morning until six o'clock in the evening in order to enable them to prepare the playing field for the afternoon game or contest.

contest. It is further agreed that nothing in this lease is to prevent the first party from renting the Fair Grounds, during the term of this lease, for circuses, carnivals or for the parking of automobiles except that the first party shall not have the right to rent out for such purpose the part of the grounds upon which the base ball diamond is located and in the event the diamond is used or leased by the first party for a circus, carnival or the parking of autombiles and by reason of which the diamond is damaged or distroyed, it shall be by the first party restored to its former conditions
