RESOLUTION. That the following resolution is adopted, and the City Clerk is instructed to forward a copy of same to Senator Robt. H. Hanson and Representative Frank Carlson.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CONCORDIA.

That our representatives and senator in the 1929 Kansas Legislature be hereby respectfully requested to support a bill to give the city a fair and just compensation for the streets built and maintained by the city and which are used as a part of the state highway

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system, such compensation to be paid the city out of the 60% apportionment of the gasoline and motor vehicle taxes apportioned to the County. We suggest \$ 2,000 per mile for improved, and \$ 500 per mile or fraction of a mile for unimproved state highway streets, and \$ 500 annually to each city having no state highway streets.

WHEREAS, there is an ever increasing demand for new services by cities and the meeting of new problems of municipal administration and economy, and

WHEREAS, the statutes relating to cities have not been revised to make proper provisions for meeting these demands,

THEREFORE, we respectfully request our representatives and senator in the 1929 Legislature to support a bill which will authorize the governor to appoint a municipal code revision commission to revise, clarify and modernize our state statutes relating to cities and that a proper appropriation be made to pay for such work.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ENACTMENT OF REVISED ORDINANCES.

Whereas, the City of Concordia, Kansas, has heretofore provided for the revision of the city ordinances by ordinance # 947, and Whereas, said ordinances have been revised, compiled and prepared for submission to the Mayor and Council, and

Whereas, under the provisions of Section 14-106, Revised Statutes of Kansas of 1923, the council is authorised, in revising the ordinances of the city, to enact the same, pursuant to such rules and regulations as the council may provide,

Now, Therefore, the following rules and regulations for enacting the revised ordinances are hereby adopted:

A. Ordinances retaining in toto and to become a part of the revised ordinances need not be read or considered, but shall continue in full force and effect the same as they now exist.

B. Ordinances which have been revised, ordinances constituting a combination of several existing ordinances, and new ordinances shall receive two several readings:

1. The first reading shall be by title only.

2. The second reading shall be by sections; any section may be changed or stricken out and new matter may be added at any time before the vote on the passage of the ordinance is taken. When the ordinance has been read and each section as written or as changed and new matter has been considered, the vote for final passage shall be taken. The vote shall be by yeas and nays, which shall be entered on the journal by the clerk. It shall require a majority of the councilmen elect to pass any ordinance; provided that if all the councilmen are present and the vote shall be a tie, the mayor shall have power to cast the deciding vote on the ordinance.

C. The second reading of an ordinance may be at the same meeting at which the ordinance is read the first time, or at an adjourned or any subsequent meeting.

D. Any rules and regulations in conflict herewith are hereby suspended during the consideration of the revised ordinances.
