Bolman, of said city, has in writing proposed to the Governing Body that he will acquire by lease, ground sufficient to maintain an approved and complete airport within three miles of said city, and will improve and complete said city as and for an approved airport, and will lease the same to said city for a term of five years, at the annual rental of one-half of a mill of the taxable property of the city of Concordia, said rental to be payable semi-annually.

And Whereas, the Governing Body deems it not advisable for said city to operate said airport when so acquired by lease from the said D.E. Bolman.

And Whereas, as a part of the proposal of the said D.E. Bolman, The Concordia Arrow Flying Service Corporation proposes to, for a period of five years, operate and maintain said airport as an approved airport, and pay to the city of Concordia, Kansas, as yearly rental the sum of One Dollar per annum.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CONCORDIA, CLOUD COUNTY, KANSAS:

That the City of Concordia, Cloud County, Kansas, by lease, acquire from D.E. Bolman an approved airport not more than three miles from said City at the annual rental of one-half of one-mill of the assessed valuation of the taxable property of Concordia, said airport to be leased for a period of five years.

(b) As a condition of this proposal on my part, and to obviate the ~~necessity~~ necessity of the city operating and maintaining said airport so acquired, I agree to organize a corporation to be called the Concordia-~~Arrow~~ Arrow Flying Service Corporation, and the City of Concordia, Kansas, is to lease or sub-lease said airport when completed and approved to said The Concordia-Arrow Flying Service corporation for a term of five years, at the annual rental of One Dollar per year, and the further consideration that said The Concordia-Arrow Flying Service Corporation will maintain, operate and conduct said airport during the term of said lease as an approved airport.

And whereas this agreement is mentioned in the warranty deed from D.A. Hanson and Sarah A. Hanson his wife to F.M. Poole recorded in book 29, Deed Records Cloud County, Kansas, page 266.

And whereas the agreement above mentioned and covering said surface water drainage sewer has never been recorded either in the Register of Deeds Office of Cloud County, Kansas, or on the records of the City Clerk of the City of Concordia, Kansas as can now be found and said agreement has become lost or destroyed and the terms thereof have been forgotten and cannot be now established and the right of the City of Concordia, to amintain said surface water drainage sewer be ascertained and determined.

And whereas it is the desire of the parties to this agreement that the right of all parties herein in and to the east twenty (20) feet of the North half (N $\frac{1}{2}$) of lot twelve (12) aforesaid be defined, fixed and established and maintained in the records of said City and the records of the Register of Deeds office of Cloud County, Kansas.

Now therefore, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto that the said City of Concordia, Kansas shall have the right to build and maintain a surface water drainage sewer over and across the North half (N $\frac{1}{2}$) of the east twenty (E20) feet of said lot twelve (12) in block ninety (90) in the City of Concordia, Kansas, as per plat of said City on file with the Register of Deeds, Cloud County, Kansas, in the future. Said surface water drainage sewer to be closed sewer with cement sides, top and bottom and to be maintained by said City and at their expense in substantially the same condition and manner as it is now built, established and maintained at the date of this agreement.

It is further agreed by and between the parties hereto that first party shall at all times have the right to go upon said east (20) feet of said North half (N $\frac{1}{2}$) of said lot twelve (12) aforesaid for the purpose of making all necessary repairs the said first party shall use due care and caution to injure the said east twenty (20) feet of said lot twelve (12) aforesaid more than is necessary and when said repairs are finished and completed shall restore said lot as near as practical to the condition said lot was in prior to the making of said repairs.

Nothing in this agreement shall prevent shall prevent second parties from using premises in any manner they see fit not inconsistent with the rights herein granted to the first party by this agreement.
