WHEREAS the city of Concordia did heretofore and on or about the first day of August 1927 pursuant to the terms of a certain Ordinance No. 936 issue its bonds in the sum of \$ 84,375.38 bearing interest at the rate of $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ per annum.

AND WHEREAS there remains unpaid out of said issue, bonds numbered 63 to 89 both numbers inclusive, representing a principal indebtedness of \$ 25,500.00 of which aggregate sum \$ 8,500.00 together with accrued interest becomes due and payable at the fiscal agency of the City of Concordia, Kansas and a like sum on the first day of August 1936 and also a like sum on the first day of August 1937.

AND WHEREAS AND under and pursuant to the terms of an ORDINANCE NO. 961 the City of Concordia issued certain bonds and there now remains unpaid a principal sum aggregating \$ 20,000.00 of which aggregate sum \$ 4,000.00 becomes due and payable at the Fiscal Agency of the City of Concordia, Kansas on the first day of August 1935.

AND WHEREAS the city of Concordia does not at this time have funds with which to retire its bonded obligation on August first 1935, and unless certain of its bonded obligations are refunded, the City of Concordia, Kansas will be obliged to default.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Concordia refund all outstanding bonds issued by it under and pursuant to the terms of ORDINANCE NO. 936 the same being bonds numbered 63 to 89, both numbers inclusive and aggregating \$ 25,500.00 exclusive of interest and as well as bonds numbered 17 to 20 both numbers inclusive issued as aforesaid under Ordinance No. 961 and aggregating \$ 4,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk, City Treasurer, City attorney and any and all other City Officers whose duties, it may be, and they are hereby instructed to take such steps and measures as may be necessary to bring about the refunding of the above and foregoing obligations of the city of Concordia pursuant to law.

This offer and proposal is made on condition that said bonds are rejected by the School Fund Commission of the State of Kansas, and that said issue shall bear a rate of interest not less than $2\frac{3}{4}\%$, and that said bonds and the transcripts in support thereof shall meet the approval of counsel representing the undersigned banks, and that said bonds shall actually be delivered within ninety (90) days from this date, and that the bonds to be refunded by such issue be surrendered and cancelled.

AND WHEREAS the Cloud County Bank, The First National Bank and the Fidelity State Bank, all of Concordia, Kansas have jointly proposed, in writing, to the governing body of the City of Concordia, Kansas to purchase said issue of refunding bonds in the sum of \$ 29,500.00 at par and accrued interest in addition thereto, pay all expense incident to the issuance thereof, provided the State School Fund Commission does not buy said bonds, all of which more fully appears from said proposal which is on file in the office of the City Clerk, and it being the desire of the governing body of the City of Concordia to accept said proposal of said Banks.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the governing body of the City of Concordia, Kansas that the proposal of said banks to purchase the above mentioned issue of the refunding bonds in the sum of \$ 29,500.00 and pay and pay the expense incident thereto provided that said bonds are not purchased by the State School Fund Commission. The same is hereby accepted according to the terms and tenor of said written proposal on the part of said banks and, upon the issuance of said bonds by the city and their rejection by the State School Fund Commission, the City Treasurer of the City of Concordia, Kansas is hereby empowered and directed, upon the payment of the principal sum of said bonds by said banks, together with accrued interest and cost of issuance thereof, to deliver said refunding bonds to said banks.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 1063.

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, and ordinance vacating a portion of Second Avenue in the City of Concordia, Kansas: was placed on its second reading, read by title and at length by unanimous consent was read and considered by sections and placed on its final passage by roll call of the following votes, "AYE", Avery, Powell, Erickson, Gillan, Rhodes, Johnson, Lambert and Francoeur. (eight) A majority of the Council elect having voted for the passage of the ordinance it was declared passed and the title agreed to.

An ordinance providing for the regulation of the purchase, sale and distribution of milk by the producers and dealers in the City of Concordia, Kansas, came up for second reading. A motion was duly made and seconded that ordinance be tabled. Motion carried.

A motion was duly made and seconded that Raymond Lambert, W. G. Thompson and Carl Johnson salarys be increased to \$95.00 per month; and Wm.W. Smith salary be increased to \$100.00 per month beginning November the 1st, 1935. Motion carried.

A motion was duly made and seconded that the matter of widening Mill Street in front of the Pump House be left to the Street and Alley Committee. Motion carried.

A motion was duly made and seconded, that officers reports be received and placed on file as follows: City Treasurer, City Clerk, Police Judge, Fire Chief and Water report. Motion carried.

Thereupon, there came up for discussion the extending of the Storm Sewer on State Street and the issuance of bonds. Whereupon there was submitted to the Council a proposal on the part of the Cloud County Bank, of Concordia, Kansas, to purchase from the City of Concordia the bonds, which proposal was in their words and figures as follows:

PROPOSAL TO PURCHASE BONDS.

TO THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF CONCORDIA, CLUCD COUNTY, KANSAS;

The undersigned, The Cloud County Bank of Concordia, Kansas, hereby proposes to the City of Concordia, Cloud County, Kansas, and its Governing Body to purchase its issuance of Sewer Bonds in approximately the amount of \$5.000.00 which bonds shall be dated December 1st, 1935, and bear interest at the rate of 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ % per annum, for par and accrued interest.

The undersigned Bank further proposes that in the event said bonds are actually issued and ready for delivery during the month of December, 1935, and said City is in need of the funds prior to said time, that it will, upon the execution and delivery by the City Treasurer of said City, of an interim receipt, pay and advance to said City the purchase price of said bonds prior to the actual issuance; provided however, that in the event the School Fund Commission of the State of Kansas shall take said bonds then such funds advanced by the undersigned

Bank shall be repaid out of the proceeds of the sale of said bonds when received by the School Fund Commission.

This proposal is made subject to the right of the School Fund Commission of the State of Kansas to purchase said bonds as provided by law.

Whereupon a motion was duly made and seconded that the following resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Concordia, Cloud County, Kansas, proposes to issue, for the purpose of extending its system of Storm Sewers, certain bonds of said City to be dated December 1st, 1935, in the sum of approximately \$5.000, such bonds to bear interest at the rate of 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ % per cent, per annum, and to mature serially in equal amounts from 1936 to 1945, and

WHEREAS, The Cloud County Bank of Concordia, Kansas, has proposed to the Governing Body of said City to purchase said issue of bonds in the sum of approximately \$5.000, as afore-said at par and accrued interest, provided the State School Fund Commission of the State of Kansas does not purchase said bonds, and has further proposed that in the event said bonds are issued during the month of December, 1935, and the city, prior to the issuance thereof, is in need of funds for the extension of said system, to advance said purchase price upon the execution and delivery to it by the City Treasurer of a proper interim receipt, and it is the desire of the Governing Body of said City that said proposal be accepted.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the proposal of said Cloud County Bank to purchase said issue of bonds in the sum of approximately \$5.000, at par and accrued interest provided said bonds are not taken by the State School Fund Commission, be and the same is hereby accepted, and upon the issuance of said bonds and their rejection by the School Fund Commission of the State of Kansas the Treasurer of the City of Concordia, Kansas, be and he is hereby authorized, empowered and directed, upon the payment of the principal sum of said bonds, together with accrued interest to the date of delivery thereof, deliver each and all of said bonds to said Bank.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the event said City is in need of the principal sum of said bonds for the purpose for which said bonds are being issued prior to their actual issuance and delivery, that the City Treasurer of Concordia, Cloud County, Kansas, be and he is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute and deliver to said Cloud County Bank an interim receipt for the purchase price of said bonds, upon the advancement of a sum of money equivalent to the purchase price thereof by said bank, which interim receipt shall provide in substance that upon the issuance and delivery of said bonds such advancement shall be retired by the delivery of said bonds to said bank, but should the School Fund Commission of the State of Kansas purchase the same then such advancement to be retired by the City Treasurer by the payment and delivery to said bank out of the proceeds of the sale of said bonds the amount it has so advanced
