#### R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission will obtain the approval of the Secretary of Agriculture of a project for the improvement of 0.154 miles of the public street in the City of Concordia, known as Lincoln Street and designated as U. S. Works Program Highway Project No. 81-23-WPMH 186 B said improvement to consist of grading and concrete pavement and to be paid for with funds obtained under The Emergency Relief Appropriation Act of 1935.

NOW THEREFORE, it is resolved by the Governing Body that in the event the above named project is approved and constructed by the State Highway Commission as called for in the plans and specifications, that the City will each year, at its own cost and expense, and subject to the provisions as set out in Section 4, Chapter 241. 1933 Session Laws, maintain the project in a manner satisfactory to the Secretary of Agriculture and the State Highway Commission

#### R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission of Kansas and the United States Bureau of Public Roads are desirous of constructing U. S. Highway No. 81 from Sixth to North City Limits except viaduct on Lincoln Street in the City of Concordia, and 0.154 miles of this is known as Project No. 81-23-WPMH 186 B State of Kansas, and

WHEREAS, said State Highway Commission of Kansas, and the United States Bureau of Public Roads of the Department of Agriculture of the United States, have made certain requirements that, if the above parties agree to construct said highway and if said Highway is to be constructed by them within said City of Concordia, said City shall agree to meet requirements hereinafter mentioned specifically.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and the Governing Body of the City of Concordia, Kansas, that in consideration of the agreement of the State Highway Commission of Kansas and the United States Bureau of Public Roads to construct said U. S. Highway No. 81 or a portion of said highway, with in the City of Concordia, Kansas, said City agrees to the following:

1. That it will require the removal of all encroachments from the limits of the right of way shown on the plans for this project; that it will require all gas and fuel dispensing pumps to be moved back of the right of way line, allowing said pumps to be placed no less than twelve feet back of the new curb line for this project; that it will remove all existing advertising signs, and will not in the future permit the erection of any advertising signs or encroachments of any kind upon the right of way of the streets of said City which are designated as connecting links of U. S. Highway No. 81 through the City of Concordia, Kansas, and that it will not permit the erection of any gas and fuel dispensing pumps between the right of way lines of said streets and that in no case will it permit the servicing of motor vehicles on the right of way of said streets designated as connecting links of the State Highway System.

2. That it will provide that all excavated trenches, within the limits of the right of way (such as excavat~~ed~~<sup>ion</sup> for sewers, water mains and connections etc.) that are made in advance of construction of the Project shall be backfilled in accordance with the State Highway Commission of Kansas specifications in advance of the construction of the Project.

not

3. That it will fix the speed limit of the City, street (or streets) used by U. S. Highway No. 81 in said City at less than thirty miles per hour.

4. That it will not permit the existence of any signs, semaphores or signals of any character that will give preference to local routes, or to the traffic of cross, or butting streets, or that will delay or hinder, traffic on these streets of said City over which the traffic of U. S. Highway No. 81 is routed; provided, however, that if "STOP AND GO" lights are in use at the present time and are deemed necessary on a portion of the route traveled by U. S. Highway No. 81, the same may be permitted with the understanding that the interval of time allowed shall not unduly slow up the traffic using the streets marked as U. S. Highway No. 81, and that no additional "STOP AND Go" lights will be installed on said Highway within said city without a concurrence by the City officials and the Kansas Highway Commission as to the necessity of said lights,<sup>2</sup>

5. That it will obtain and provide in advance of construction all the right of way in said City, as shown on the approved plans to be necessary to construct the project.

6. That it will save the State Highway Commission of Kansas and the United States Bureau of Public Roads forever harmless from any and all damages which may accrue to any person or corporations by reason of said right of way being obtained; and further agrees that it will not pass any laws, rules, regulations or ordinances which would be in conflict with the above agreement.

P. S. Land sold to Concordia Building and Loan.

That it will require the removal of all encroachments from the limits of the right-of-way shown on the plans for this project that it will require all gas and fuel dispensing pumps to be moved back of the right-of-way line, allowing said pumps to be placed no less than twelve feet back of the new curb line for this project; that it will remove all existing advertising signs, and will not in the future permit the erection of any advertising signs or encroachments of any kind, upon the right-of-way of the streets of said city which are designated as connecting links of US Highway No. 81 through the City of Concordia, Kansas, and that it will not permit the erection of any gas and fuel dispensing pumps between the right-of-way lines of said streets and that in no case will it permit the servicing of motor vehicles on the right-of-way of said streets designated as connecting links of the State Highway System.

2. That it will provide that all excavated trenches, within the limits of the right-of-way (such an excavation for sewers, water mains and connections etc.) that are made in advance of construction of the project shall be back filled in accordance with State Highway Commission of Kansas specifications in advance of the construction of the project.

3. That it will not fix the speed limit of the city street (or streets) used by US Highway No. 81 in said city at less than thirty miles per hour.

4. That it will not permit the existence of any signs, semaphores or signals of any character that will give preference to local routes, or to the traffic of cross, of abutting streets, or that will delay, or hinder, traffic on these streets of said City over which the traffic of US Highway No. 81 is routed; provided, however, that if "STOP AND GO" lights are in use at the present time and are deemed necessary on a portion of the route traveled by US Highway No. 81, the same may be permitted with the understanding that the interval of time allowed shall not unduly slow up the traffic using the street marked as US Highway No. 81, and that no additional "STOP AND GO" lights will be installed on said highway within said city without a concurrence by the City officials and the Kansas Highway Commission as to the necessity of said lights.

5. That it will obtain and provide in advance of construction all the right-of-way in said city, as shown on the approved plans to be necessary to construct the project, including the right-of-way for borrow pits and channel changes.
