May 13th and 20th, 1937, the notice of the intention of the City of Concordia, Kansas, and its governing body, to make certain repairs, extensions and improvements to and upon its present existing waterworks system and to defray the expense thereof by the issuance of negotiable Revenue Bonds, which said notice was on said May 13, 1937, signed by all the Councilmen of said city.

And thereupon a printed copy of such notice, with the affidavit of the printer of the Kansan showing the publication of such notice in said newspaper on May 13th, 1937, and May 20th, 1937, was exhibited to the governing body. It was moved by Avery, and duly seconded, that said notice be approved as to form and as to manner and time of publication. The motion prevailed and said notice was approved.

At the request of the Mayor the City Clerk then reported that no written protest against the making of such repairs, extensions and improvements or the issuance of Revenue Bonds as aforesaid had been filed with him within fifteen (15) days after the first publication of the notice aforesaid, or at any other time.

And thereupon Councilman Erickson presented and moved the adoption of the following

RESOLUTION

"Whereas, the governing body of the City of Concordia, Kansas, has deemed it proper and to the best interests of said city and its citizens to repair, extend and improve its present existing waterworks system in certain particulars, at a cost of \$14,000.00, and to issue Revenue Bonds in payment of the cost thereof as permitted by sections 12-805a to 12-805k of the General Statutes of 1935; and,

"Whereas, said governing body, by ordinance numbered 1095 duly ordained and published, has declared its intention to make such repairs, extensions and improvements and to issue such Revenue Bonds, and has directed that notice thereof be published as provided by law; and,

"Whereas, said governing body has caused to be published in the Kansas, the official paper of said municipality, a notice of its intention so to do, which notice described the nature of the said proposed repairs, extensions and improvements, stated the total amount of the cost thereof to be \$14,000.00 and the amount of the bonds proposed to be issued in payment thereof to be \$14,000.00; and which notice further provided that if within fifteen (15) days after its first publication there should be filed with the City Clerk of Concordia, Kansas, a written protest against such proposed repairs, extensions or improvements and such bond issue, signed by not less than ten percent of the qualified electors of said city, the governing body of said city would submit such proposed project and bond issue to the electors of said city at a special election to be called for that purpose as provided by law; and,

"Whereas, no such protest has been filed and more than fifteen (15) days have elapsed since the first publication of said notice; and,

"Whereas, the governing body of said city is now authorized by section 12-805h of the General Statutes of 1935 to contract for or make such repairs, extensions and improvements and issue such Revenue Bonds in payment of the cost thereof, by a two-thirds vote of said governing body, without submitting to a vote of such municipality the proposal to contract for or make such extensions, repairs and improvements and to issue such bonds in payment of the cost thereof;

"NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved by the governing body of the City of Concordia, Kansas, that said city cause the following specified repairs, extensions and improvements to be made to its present existing waterworks system, to wit:

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 1, 1937 (Continued).

(a). The replacement of a six-inch water main, beginning at the small water tower located between Sixth and Seventh Streets on Third Avenue and running thence south 1380 feet, by an eight-inch feeder line to tie into a four-inch lateral main running east on Tenth Street;

(b). The replacement of a four-inch water main, beginning at a point on Third Avenue and Eighth Street and running thence east to the center of Willow Avenue, by an eight-inch feeder line;

(c). The replacement of a four-inch water main, beginning at the north side of Eighth Street at Willow Avenue, running thence south 922 feet to a point on Tenth Street and Willow Avenue and thence east 575 feet, by a six-inch feeder line to tie into a six-inch feeder line running north and south on Republican Avenue;

(d). The installation of a new four-inch lateral water main beginning on the west side of Broadway at Thirteenth Street and running thence west 1453 feet to the west side of Cedar Avenue at Thirteenth Street;

(e). The repairing and improving of existing valves located on Cedar Avenue at Eleventh Street, Tenth Street, Ninth Street, Eighth Street and Seventh Street; and,

(f). The replacement of existing pumping equipment, by one or more pumps of greater pumping capacity; and other necessary improvement in connection therewith.

"Be it further Resolved that the exact and total cost of said repairs, extensions and improvements be \$14,000.00;

"And be it lastly Resolved that Revenue Bonds, in the standard form be issued to defray the said cost of such repairs, extensions and improvements, to be dated June 1, 1937, to mature \$2,000.00 June 1, 1938, to June 1, 1944, both inclusive, to be in the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, bearing 3½% interest from date, payable semi-annually at the State Fiscal Agency in Topeka, Kansas; and that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare a bond ordinance accordingly."

The motion that said resolution be adopted was duly seconded and upon roll call the following Councilmen voted "aye": Avery, Godfrey, Erickson, Rhodes, Johnson, Francoeur, and Peltier. No one voted "nay", the Council-elect having unanimously voted to adopt the resolution, it was declared adopted and made the act of the governing body.

And thereupon an ordinance numbered 1096 and entitled: "An Ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$14,000.00 of Municipal Waterworks Revenue Bonds of the City of Concordia, Kansas, for the purpose of providing funds to defray the expense of making certain repairs, extensions and improvements to and upon its present existing waterworks system, prescribing all of the details of said bonds, providing for the collection, segregation and distribution of the income of the waterworks utility of said city for the purpose of paying the cost of its operation, maintenance and improvement, providing for an adequate depreciation fund therefore and for paying the principal of and interest upon said Revenue Bonds," was presented by the City Attorney and read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Francoeur, and duly seconded, that said ordinance be placed on its second reading and considered by sections. The motion prevailed and it was so ordered. The ordinance was read and considered by sections and each section was on motion approved. It was moved by Councilman Erickson, and duly seconded, that said ordinance be placed on final passage and adopted as a whole. On roll call the following Councilmen voted "aye": Avery, Godfrey, Erickson, Rhodes, Johnson, Francoeur, and Peltier, and no Councilman voted "nay." The motion prevailed and the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted.

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF JUNE 1, 1937 (Continued).


It was moved by Councilman Johnson and duly seconded that the Ways and Means Committee be instructed to provide for a sufficient levy of taxes to pay the interest and principal on the outstanding waterworks general obligation bonds so that the revenues of the waterworks system may be used to pay interest and principal on the revenue bonds now being issued. The motion prevailed and it was so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and seconded the meeting was adjourned.
