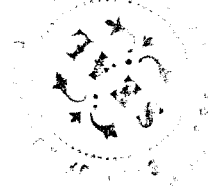

Whereas, The Missouri Pacific Railroad claims that it has overpaid the City Water Department to an extent of about \$9,000.00, over a period of several years; and,

Whereas, this Governing Body has given the said claim and the interested parties hearings and have investigated the same; and,

Whereas, it is the sense of this Governing Body, after such hearings and investigations, that the City of Concordia, Kansas, is not obligated to said railroad either financially or morally;

Now, Therefore, Be it resolved that the claim of said railroad be and it is hereby denied; and be it further resolved that to prevent a repetition of such misunderstandings this Governing Body directs the Water Department to install and service city owned meters

to measure water hereafter furnished to said railroad, and to negotiate with said railroad for a new water contract.

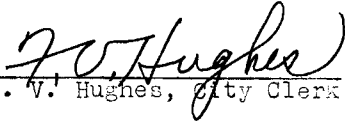
