

REGULAR MEETING FEBRUARY 3, 1941.

The Council met in regular session in the Mayors office in the City Hall, Monday, February 3, 1941, at the hour of 7:30 P. M., Mayor Powell presiding with the following Councilmen present: Avery, Godfrey, Erickson, Breault, Rhodes, Johnson, Francoeur and Peltier.

Minutes of previous meeting approved and read.

Order of business.

Thereupon Mayor Powell nominated Mr. Carl Ossmann as a member of Board of Examiners for Gas Inspectors.

Upon motion seconded and carried, the above recommendation of Mayor Powell be approved and confirmed.

Application to "etail Cereal Malt Beverage (Individual Consumption on premises)

George D. Barnett 502 Washington Street,

Upon motion seconded and carried, that the above application be granted.

Upon motion seconded and carried, that when application is presented to operate bowling alley at 303½ West 6th Street the City Clerk is instructed to issue a license.

Upon motion seconded and carried, that H. D. Fisk conform with city ordinance regarding the building of a fire wall on his building at 309 West 5th Street.

Upon motion seconded and carried, that the contracting of the sale of bonds for the proposed work on Lincoln Street be tabled until we hear from State Legislature.

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Clerk, and City Treasurer be and they are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do any and all things necessary to transfer from the "Special Second Street Road Oil Fund" to the Street and Alley Fund of the City of Concordia, Kansas, the sum of \$462.05, and the interest on same in the amount of 17.52 for the period of one year and one month, and to cause the payment and cancellation of Warrant No 757 issued against the Street and Alley Fund to the Cloud County Bank on December 4, 1939.

Said resolution was read, considered and voted upon, and motion for adoption unanimously carried.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, this governing body of the City of Concordia, Kansas, deems it necessary and expedient to repave those parts of certain streets and alleys in said city which have previously been and are now paved, to-wit:

The alley running through Blocks 136, 135 and 134 for the three consecutive blocks from the West side of Lincoln Avenue to the East side of State Avenue exclusive of the areas formed by the intersections of said alley with Broadway and Washington Avenues; the alley running through Blocks 147, 148 and 149 for the three consecutive blocks from the West side of Lincoln Avenue to the East side of State Avenue exclusive of the areas formed by the intersections of said alley with Broadway and Washington Avenue, the portion of Sixth Street running between Block 6 and 7 in Gaylord and Matthews Addition for the one block from the West side of Willow Avenue to the East side of First Avenue; and the portion of Eighth Street running between Blocks 112 and 127 for the one block from the West side of Washington Avenue to the East side of State Avenue; and

WHEREAS, this said governing body deems it necessary to

and with Elmhurst Boulevard. and of Tenth Street with Willow Avenue; and Lincoln Street with Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth and Thirteenth, and, W

WHEREAS, this said governing body deems it necessary to repave at the expense of the city as a whole, that portion of Cedar Avenue for the seven blocks from the South side of Eleventh Street to the South side of Eighteenth Street, including the areas formed by the intersections of said portion of Cedar Avenue with other streets and alleys, which said portion of Cedar Avenue connects a paved street in said city with the grounds of Pleasant Hill Cemetery, a cemetery owned by the City of Concordia, Kansas, and situated within two miles of said city; and

WHEREAS, plans and specifications for such repaving and preliminary estimates of the cost thereof have been filed by the City Engineer in the office of the City Clerk of said city;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by this governing body of said city of Concordia, Kansas, that such repaving be and it is hereby declared necessary and expedient to be done; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said plans and specifications and said preliminary estimates of the cost be and they are hereby adopted and approved; and,

Be it further resolved, that said repaving be done forthwith by force account by the said city using its own employees under the direction of its city engineer; and,

Be it further resolved, that, having consideration for the value of the abutting property and the extent of the traffic upon said six blocks of alleys, said one block of Sixth Street and said one block on Eighth Street, so to be repaved, this governing body finds that it will be fair and just to apportion the expense of such repaving so that said city of Concordia, at large will sustain one-third of the total expense of said repaving as permitted by section 14-511a of the Kansas General Statutes of 1935. and,

Be it further resolved, that, the street and alley repair and general improvement funds of said city being insufficient to meet the cost and expense of all the repaving by this resolution declared to be necessary and so allotted to and assessed against said city, the internal improvement general obligation bonds of said city be issued to pay therefor and taxes be levied upon the whole of the taxable property within the confines of the city limits of said city sufficient to pay the interest and retire the bonds so issued within a period of time not to exceed ten years; and,

Be it lastly resolved, that the remaining two-thirds of the expense of the repaving of said alleys and said two blocks of streets be charged against, and paid by levying special taxes therefor upon, the abutting property on each side of said streets and alleys as now provided by law; that said special taxes be made payable in installments; and that bonds be issued therefor as now provided by law.

Said resolution was read, considered and voted upon and motion for adoption unanimously carried.

ORDINANCE NO. 1147.

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, AND ORDINANCE declaring it to be necessary to repave and providing for the repaving of Cedar Avenue from the South Side of Eleventh Street to the South side of Eighteenth Street, for the repaving of Sixth Street between Willow and First Avenues, for the repaving of Eighth Street between Washington and State Avenues, and for the repaving certain intersections of streets and avenues, all in the City of Concordia, Kansas, was read by the City Clerk. It was moved by Councilman Breault and duly seconded that said Ordinance be placed on its second reading and considered by sections. The motion prevailed and it was so ordered. The Ordinance was read and considered by sections and each section was upon motion approved. It was moved by Councilman Rhodes and duly seconded that said Ordinance be placed upon its final passage and adopted as a whole. On roll call the following Councilmen voted "Aye", Avery, Godfrey, Erickson, Breault, Rhodes, Johnson, Francoeur and Feltier. And no Councilman voted "Nay". The motion prevailed and the Mayor declared the Ordinance adopted.

The Ordinance was read and considered by sections and each section was upon motion approved. It was moved by Councilman Johnson and duly seconded, that said Ordinance be placed upon its final passage and adopted as a whole. Upon motion seconded and carried that we go into executive session.

Upon motion seconded and carried that the matter of re-locating light switches in alleys be left to light committee with power to act.

RESOLUTION concerning revocation of Leo F. Fishcer's been license.

WHEREAS, this governing body has probable cause to believe that this city's class A cereal malt beverage license numbered 1367, dated December 26, 1940, is subject to revocation pursuant to section 21-2706 of the 1939 Supplement to the Kansas General Statutes of 1935 and section 10 of Ordinance No. 1091 of this city;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by this governing body of the City of Concordia, Kansas, that the matter of revoking said license be taken up by this governing body at its regular meeting on the 7th day of April, 1941; that proper notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting be executed by the mayor and clerk and be personally served by the marshal of this city on Leo F. Fischer, the person holding said license, at least five days before the date of said meeting; and that at said meeting said Leo F. Fischer and all other persons concerned be allowed a full hearing.

Said resolution was read, considered and voted upon and motion for adoption unanimously carried.

RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS, By its ordinance numbered 1146, published January 19, 1941, the City of Concordia, Kansas, inadvertantly attempted to assess, for certain recurbing and reguttering of Washington Avenue between Sixth and Seventh Streets and of Seventh Street between State and Washington Avenues, the sums of \$23.85 and \$46.00 against the United States government, upon the adjacent lots numbered 35, 36, 37, 38, 39 and 40 in block 134 owned by the government and occupied in said city by the United States postoffice; and,

WHEREAS, Such attempted assessment is contrary to the provisions of section 12-604 of the Kansas General Statutes of 1935, and is therefore invalid and void.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it hereby resolved that the city clerk of this said city is instructed to cancel said attempted special assessments upon said postoffice lots and to charge said assessments to the city at large.

Said resolution was read, considered and voted upon and motion for adoption unanimously carried.

RESOLUTION: To repave Lincoln Avenue

WHEREAS, The portion of Lincoln Avenue in the City of Concordia, Kansas, between the south side of Sixth Street and the north side of Fourteenth Street, is a paved street which was originally curbed, guttered and a base and surfacing constructed in accordance with specifications; and whereas, the surfacing of such paved street by reason of the wear and tear of traffic is in a condition which requires repairing and resurfacing in order to preserve the base of same and to provide a reasonably smooth wearing surface; and whereas, a preliminary estimate of the cost of such repairing and

resurfacing has been filed with the city clerk of said city by the city engineer of said city; and whereas, this governing body of said city, which is an incorporated city of the second class, deems it now necessary and expedient to resurface and repair said portion of Lincoln Avenue, as authorized by sections 12-602 and 12-614 of the Kansas General Statutes of 1935:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by this governing body of City of Concordia, Kansas, that said resurfacing and repairing of said portion of Lincoln Avenue in said city is hereby declared necessary; that said city engineer's preliminary estimate of the cost thereof is hereby adopted and approved; that said work is hereby ordered and shall be done at the expense of the said city, by force account under the direction of its city engineer; that the payment of the cost of such resurfacing and repairing shall be made by the issuance of improvement bonds of the said city; that such bonds shall be made payable at such times as this governing body shall provide by ordinance, but none of such bonds shall run longer than ten years nor bear interest at a rate exceeding five per cent (5%) per annum and the credit of said city shall be pledge to the payment thereof; provided, however, that before such bonds shall be issued and the work begun, a question of performing such work on those parts of said portion of Lincoln Avenue not included within the areas formed by the intersections of said Lincoln Avenue with Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth and Thirteenth Streets, and of issuing such bonds to pay therefor, shall be submitted to a vote of the electors of the said city at a special election, which this governing body deems it advisable to call and hold along with the regular city election on April 1, 1941.

After reading the foregoing resolution, it was thereupon moved by Councilman Johnson and duly seconded, that said resolution be adopted. Said motion was considered and the provisions of said resolution was discussed and after such consideration and discussion the motion was passed. Councilmen voting in favor of the resolution were as follows: Avery, Godfrey, Breault, Erickson, Johnson, Rhodes, Francoeur and Peltier, and no Councilman voted "Nay".

Upon motion seconded and carried that we pay usage tax under protest.

Upon motion seconded and carried that the request of Mr. Barrett to procure a license to operate a Pool Hall be tabled.

Thereupon Mayor Powell nominated Mr. A. C. (Bugs) Browne to the office of Volunteer Fireman.

Upon motion seconded and carried that the above appointment of Mayor Powell's be approved and confirmed.

Upon motion seconded and carried that the Chief of Police serve notice on Leo Fischer of 114 W. 6th St., that the Council will consider the matter of revoking his beer license at its meeting April 7, 1941.

An Ordinance entitled an Ordinance Authorizing and providing for the issuance of \$9,469.44 Internal Improvement Bonds of the City of Concordia, Kansas, to pay the cost of recurbing and reguttering certain parts of the streets and avenues of said city was read by the city clerk. It was moved by Councilman Erickson and duly seconded that said ordinance be placed on its second reading and considered by sections. The motion prevailed and it was so ordered. The Ordinance was read and considered by sections and each section was upon motion approved. It was moved by Councilman Johnson and duly seconded, that said Ordinance be placed upon its final passage and adopted as a whole. On roll call the following Councilmen voted "Aye": Avery, Godfrey, Erickson, Breault, Rhodes, Johnson, Francoeur and Peltier, and no councilman voted "Nay".


An Ordinance entittled an Ordinance providing for the calling of a special election in and for the City of Concordia, Kansas, for the purpose of submitting to the electors of said city the proposition of authorizing the said city's governing body to perform the work and issue the bonds of said city for the purpose of resurfacing and repairing Lincoln Avenue in said City between the south side of Sixth Street and the north side of Fourteenth Street, exclusive of the areas formed by the intersections of said avenue with other streets was read by the city clerk. It was moved by Councilman Peltier and duly seconded that said ordinance be placed on its second reading and considered by sections. The motion prevailed and it was so ordered. The ordinance was read and considered by sections and each section was upon motion approved. It was moved by Councilman Avery and duly seconded that said ordinance be placed upon its final passage and adopted as a whole. On roll call the following Councilmen voted "Aye", Avery, Godfrey, Erickson, Breault, Rhodes, Johnson, Francoeur and Peltier, and no councilman voted "Nay". The motion prevailed and the mayor declared the motion adopted.
