ORDINANCE NO. 1177.

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: And ordinance levying taxes and authorizing the City Clerk, to certify such levy to the county clerk, was read by the city clerk. It was moved by councilman Myers and seconded by councilman Hormel that said ordinance be placed on its seconded reading and considered by sections. The motion prevailed and was so ordered. The ordinance was read and considered by sections and each section was upon motion approved. It was moved by councilman Hormel and duly seconded that said ordinance be placed upon its final passage and adopted as a whole. On Roll call the following councilmen voted "Aye": Myers, Hormel, Curl, Manwarring, Walden, Perry, and Johnston. Acting Mayor Peltier declared the ordinance adopted.

The Electric Light Committee made the following written report:

To the Mayor and council:

Your Electric Light Committee has met and considered the proposed street lighting contract offered by the Kansas Power Company. Your committee reports that it does not at this time recommend acceptance of the power company's offer for the reasons: (1) It is not clear to this committee just how much the city is to pay on a basis of kilowatt hours for the electric energy to be consumed under the proposed contract; (2) While the proposed contract would effect a saving to the city as compared with present street-lighting rates, yet the present rates are subject to reduction while the proposed contract would fix the new rates for five years; (3) This committee believes it would not be expedient to enter into a five-year contract, which would over-lap the term of the power company's franchise; (4) This committee does not believe the proposed reduction in street lighting rates is substantial enough to justify entering into a contract which would preclude the city from asking for further reductions for five years; (5) This committee invites a rate schedule which would also effect a reduction in the city's cost of water pumping.

Motion made, duly seconded and carried the Light Committee's report be accepted.

Motion made seconded and carried building committee's report that Continuation Certificate Bond No. 181337-8 Ohio Casualty Insurance Company Beulah Morgan Water Department obligee in the amount of \$5,000.00 premium \$25.00 one year be accepted.

Motion made seconded and carried that city employees shall receive wages allowed by O.P.A. on city equipment rental, when such an amount is paid to the City of Concordia for such service by the Federal Government.

Motion made seconded and carried that City Clerk be instructed to draw resolution, thanking Captain Davalos, Fire Chief and all the firemen from the Camp for the very valuable assistance they rendered at Leidigh Lumber Company fire.

Be it resolved by this Coverning Body of the City of Concordia, Kansas, that this sity desires to avail itself of the benefits and privileges of chapter 169 of the laws passed at the 1943 session of the Kansas legislature; and that hereafter, [whenever at any particular time the necessity arises during any emergency occurring at the Concordia Prisoner of War Camp and the fire chief or person in charge of the lire department of the city determines that the city can space a portion of its fire equipment and firemen, not to exceede one truck at any time ) the firemen and officers of the fire department of the city, together with such equipment, shall so beyond the territorial limits of the city to assist in meeting such emergency at such camp.
