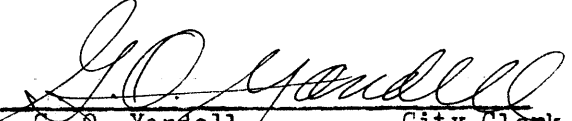
And thereupon appropriation ordinance No. 121 was approved and passed according to law.

And thereupon appropriation ordinance No. 122 was approved and passed according to law.

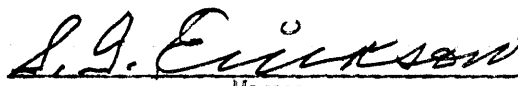
ORDINANCE NO. 1204.

It was moved by Councilman Peltier and seconded by Councilman Hebert that the ordinance be placed on its second reading and considered by sections, the motion prevailed and was so ordered. The ordinance was read by sections and each section was upon motion approved. It was moved by Councilman Peltier and seconded by Councilman Myers that the ordinance be placed on its final passage and adopted as a whole. On roll call the following councilmen voted "Aye": Myers, Stamm, Curl, Manwarring, Walden, Perry, Hebert & Peltier. Thereupon Mayor Erickson declared the ordinance adopted.

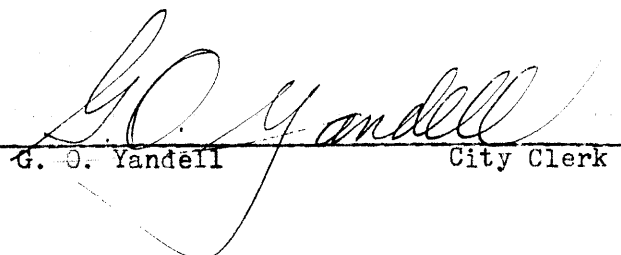

Motion made seconded and carried that the appointment be confirmed.

The following officers reports were read and ordered place on file, Clerk, Chief of Police, Police Judge, Fire Chief.

The City Engineer made a report as to the water department for the past year, 1946 and this was ordered placed on file and the engineer to be commended for this report.

There being no further business to come before the council the Council did adjourn.
