That the benefit district within such city shall be defined as follows:

Lots Four (4), Five (5), and Six (6), Block Four (4) of Gaylord and Matthews Addition of Concordia, Kansas;

and such benefit district shall be assessed for such improvements including intersections according to the assessed valuation for taxation of such lots and blocks as provided by law.

Be it further resolved that this Resolution be published in two consecutive issues of The Kansas, the Official City paper.

The foregoing resolution was duly passed by the governing body of the City of Concordia, Kansas, and approved on the 7th day of February, 1949.
