WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to the Administrator a Project Application dated May 22, 1959, for a grant of Federal funds for a project for development of the Blosser Municipal Airport (herein called the "Airport"), together with plans and specifications for such project, which Project Application, as approved by the Administrator, is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, The Administrator has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following described airport development:

Construct administration building, auto parking area (approx. $40' \times 75'$), and entrance road; acquire north and south clear zones (Areas II and III, avigation easements).

(This acquisition and construction is in addition to the development covered by Project No. 9-14-007-701).

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to and for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airpot Act (60 Stat. 170; Pub. Law 377, 79th Congress), and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances contained in said Project Application, and its acceptance of this Offer, as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport, as herein provided,

THE ADMINISTRATOR, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE UNITED STATES, HEREBY OFFERS AND AGREES to pay, as the United States' share of costs incurred in accomplishing the project, 50 per centum of all allowable project costs, subject to the following terms and conditions:

- I. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this Offer shall be \$11,600.00.
- 2. The Sponsor shall

The Sponsor hereby covenants and agrees that, to the extent that the Sponsor holds or may hereafter acquire ownership or such other rights as may legally allow it to carry out its obligations under this covenant, it will not permit or suffer any growth, structure, or object, except farm crops, grazing animals or such structures as are necessary as aids to air navigation on any land lying within zones, trapezoid in shape, extending outwardly 100 feet from points located 100 feet outward from each end of the N/S landing strip along the centerline thereof as projected outward, the said zones each being 250 feet wide at the said beginning points, measured 125 feet on each side of the said projected centerline, and increasing to a width of 450 feet as their outer

It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that this Grant Offer, insofar as that portion concerning construction of the administration building and paving of an entrance road and parking area, is made and accepted on the basis of the preliminary plans submitted with the aforesaid Project Application; the parties hereby further covenant and agree that prior to August 31, 1959, the Sponsor shall furnish final plans and specifications to the Administrator for said work, that no construction work on the administration building, entrance road, or parking area will be commenced hereunder nor will there be any advertisement for bids for accomplishing such work until said final plans and specifications have been approved by the Administrator or his duly authorized representative; and the parties do hereby further covenant and agree that any reference made in this Grant Offer or in the aforesaid Project Application to plans and specifications shall be considered as having reference to said final plans and specifications as so approved.
