

Mr. Ball reports that since the protective chicken wire fence no longer exists, the cardboard boxes and papers whether afire or not blow over the countryside. Mr. Ball also brought up the question of who would be responsible, City, County or trash haulers for fires started on lands adjacent to the landfill and also he asked the Commission if the City had insurance to cover these fires. After a short conversation, the Mayor advised Mr. Ball that the City would look into this problem immediately.

#### PROPOSED PARKING LOT

Mrs. Helen Leckberg was present and expressed her opposition among other items to the City participating in the proposed parking lot expenses.

## NATIONAL AND STATE SAFETY PROGRAM

City Manager Brodbeck presented to the Commission for their consideration a Safety Program proposed by Federal and State agencies. After a short discussion the Commissioners directed the City Manager to proceed with the program where it pertained to the City.
