The Library Board has been working on plans to improve present library facilities for the past two years, before it was known that Senator Carlson would retire and that his effects would be available.

## REQUEST EXAMINED

The present library is an old structure of wood construction with stone facing and is a fire hazard. Its heating plant, plumbing, windows and lighting need replacing. The ceiling needs lowering or replastering. The roof needs replacing. Restroom facilities are inadequate.

Additional book space is sorely needed, and architects have advised that adding additional weight would require a major restructuring. They also advise that such a remodeling job would cost \$50,000 and is not economically justifiable.

Other cities have found that it is more practical to build a new library than to remodel. Some examples: Iola, population 7,039, total cost \$242,000. Neodesha, population 4,285, total cost \$168,064. Pratt, population 7,670, total cost \$294,606.

Preliminary estimates are that a new library could be built at the present library site at a cost of \$200,000 for the structure. By using matching federal funds, Concordia's share would be \$100,000. This can be financed by a levy of 1 mill for 10 years. Matching funds are impossible to obtain for remodeling.

After the levy has been in effect for two years, bonds can be issued against this, providing \$100,000 for construction.

Since these plans were made, we have learned that it is possible for Concordia to obtain the personal library and effects of Senator Carlson at no cost to the City taxpayers. Friends of Senator Carlson have told him they would like to have a national campaign to raise funds to pay for furnishings if suitable housing can be found. A national campaign should provide a sizeable amount. Matching federal funds for this should also be available.

Senator Carlson is the only Kansan who has ever served as State Legislator, Congressman, Governor and Senator. He has great national stature. His personal effects and library have been sought by several other places including the Eisenhower library at Abilene.

The Library Board believes this is a unique opportunity to provide a major attraction for Concordia, in addition to a much-needed new library facility.
