# **SWIMMING LESSONS**

## MARSHFIELD CLINIC HEALTH SYSTEM YMCA

#### **GALVIN AVENUE TRAIL\***

A 1-mile long asphalt trail located between Becker Road and nearly to 4th Street. On-road bike lane from Becker Road to McMillan Street.

#### GRIESE PARK TRAIL

Located at Griese Park, 1001 E. 29th Street, the trail is a 3/4-mile long, 8-foot-wide, asphalt surface.

### HAMUS NATURE PRESERVE & RECREATION AREA

Located at 210 Wilderness View Drive. This 32acre area includes 1 mile of asphalt trails and over 1.5 miles of natural surface trails.

#### **HEWITT-MARSH TRAIL\***

The Hewitt-Marsh Trail from Veterans Parkway at 29th Street to Stadt Road. The trail is approximately 1.5 miles long.

## JOE & BERNADINE WEBER'S NATURE PARK TRAILS

This 37-acre city park accessible at the corner of Holly Avenue and 5th Street includes a .3-mile asphalt trail plus over 1.5 miles of natural surface trails.

## MARSHFIELD OUTDOOR LEARNING SANCTUARY

Located behind Tiny Tiger Intergenerational Center, at 905 Tiny Tiger Court. This 3.2 acre wetland includes boardwalk trails and a shelter that seats 30 people.

#### MCMILLAN MARSH TRAIL

Located north of Marshfield off Mann Road at the McMillan Marsh Wildlife Area, this trail boasts a distance of 6.25 miles with a surface combination of crushed lime and gravel. The McMillan Marsh Trail is open May 1 until September 1.

#### MILLCREEK BUSINESS PARK TRAIL\*

Located on Marshfield's southside. Preferred access to trail is at 29th & Apple. This trail is approximately 2.6 miles long.

#### PRAIRIE RUN TRAIL\*

An asphalt trail located at Adams Avenue and McMillan Street.

This asphalt trail can be found on the south side of Veterans Parkway between Oak Avenue and 29th Street. The trail is 3 miles long.

#### **WILDWOOD MCMILLAN TRAIL**

A 2.5 mile long asphalt trail that is both on road and off road. It can be found between 17th Street and McMillan.

#### WILDWOOD PARK TRAILS

Wildwood Park contains a number of trails of both granite and asphalt suitable for biking and walking.



PARKS TRAIL MAP



#### **Curbside Recycling Service**

- Pickup is **EVERY OTHER WEEK** in provided wheeled cart on the same day as your garbage collection.
- Recyclables must be placed curbside the night before, or prior to 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection.
- Place all recyclables in the provided cart no sorting necessary.

Items accepted for recycling include:



#### **Aluminum Cans**

Beverage cans only

#### **Container Glass**



Clear, brown and green container glass only. Glass should be rinsed clean. **DOES NOT INCLUDE:** ceramic cups, dishes, ovenware, plate glass, safety and window glass, heat-resistant glass such as Pyrex, light bulbs, mirrors, or lead-based glass such as crystal.

#### **Plastic Containers**



Food, beverage, pill and detergent bottles/ containers marked with the #1 through #7 recycling emblem only. Includes aseptic packaging such as juice boxes and soup broth containers. **DOES NOT INCLUDE:** motor oil bottles, plastic bags, Styrofoam cups or containers, and packaging peanuts.

#### Tin Cans

Metals cans, bi-metal cans, and steel containers. Tin cans should be rinsed clean. Securely place cut tops inside of the can.

#### **Mixed Papers**



All grades of paper including: white, colored, ledger, shiny, coated, carbonless, envelopes (window, labeled, Kraft), newspaper, magazines, phone books, computer paper, file folders, file or packing boxes, glued pads and tablets, file folders, post-it notes, spiral notebooks, cereal boxes, junk mail, shoes boxes, paper grocery bags, shredded paper, beverage cartons. Can include paper clips and staples. All paper products should be placed in a paper bag or bundled. **DOES NOT INCLUDE:** waxed paper, hand towels, napkins or paper plates.






