

Charles L. Holland - Class of 1975

Charles Lee "Chuck" Holland set a goal while attending Maumee High School to become an engineer. Chuck graduated from MHS in 1975 and attended the University of Toledo to pursue his goal. While Holland attended college, he began his part time job with UPS, in the Industrial Engineering department as a data gatherer. He had no idea that he would eventually end up helping to shape UPS into the global company we currently know.

He completed his degree in Industrial Engineering, graduating at the top of this discipline. As a result, Chuck was offered many jobs including industry giants, IBM and GE, but chose to stay with UPS as an Industrial Engineer there. In obtaining this position, Holland could begin to learn new ways to help his company succeed. New opportunities allowed Chuck to accept positions with increasing responsibility.

As experience and responsibility increased, he was able to open new buildings, design procedures for UPS's new airline, and eventually become a Department manager. The next promotion led to responsibility for the Industrial Engineering and Operations activities for the Northwest Region. Chuck was able to assist in moving the region from consistently ranked last to the top.

A few years later, Chuck was promoted to the UPS Corporate Headquarters as Vice President of Engineering for UPS Supply Chain Solutions.
