GREETINGS FROM THE SUPERVISOR-TONYA KETZLER

Happy New Year, and welcome to the third edition of Mundy Township's community newsletter! This is a new-ish publication that the Township Board began experimenting with last year – sending a periodic community update to all residents and property owners in Mundy Township. And in this new budget year, I'm pleased to report that my peers on the board have decided to make it a regular, quarterly fixture for mailboxes across the community going forward! We hope you'll find it a worthy effort to improve communication coming from the Township Hall and keep the community updated on happenings across Mundy Township.

2024 will certainly be an exciting year here in Mundy Township. If I had to sum it up in two buzz words, we'll be keeping busy with "elections" and "building." There's plenty of changes taking place with the administration of elections in Michigan this year. So much so that we dedicated this cover of this newsletter to the Clerk and elections information! I'm confident the Mundy Township Clerk's office is dedicated to delivering a seamless experience for our voters, so make sure to check out their section to learn what to expect at the polls in 2024.

On the "building" front, we're focusing on a few categories: building community, building better communication, and (literally) building public amenities and infrastructure.

In building community, I'm talking about building the Mundy Township brand and identity. There's much to be proud of in being a member of the Mundy Township community, but we find that many folks identify more with the school district or zip code they live in rather than Mundy Township itself. We'll continue working hard throughout 2024 to change that by investing in things like the Mundy Miracle Commons and pushing the "Mundy" name to be used more widely. Our Hill Road Corridor Improvement Authority has even approved adding welcome signs at key locations that we hope will be installed later this year. And quite significantly, we're undertaking an update to the community Master Plan. This is a process that demands local participation, so please consider attending our Master Plan Open House at the township hall on January 31, 2024 from 6:00-7:30 pm. Other Master Plan update public input opportunities will also be announced in the future, including an upcoming community survey that is open to all.

In building better communication, I might point to something like this newsletter. We're also introducing new efforts this year to have dedicated communication, and on an increasing basis, with Mundy Township businesses and members of our Hill Road commercial corridor, along with a separate effort for stakeholders in the future development of the Mundy Miracle Commons. This will include regular email communications and a one-pager newsletter from myself dedicated to the Commons. Our website will also be an area of focus, as we work to make it more user friendly based on feedback we receive. So, please let us know if you have suggestions on how we can improve!

In building public amenities and infrastructure, I couldn't be more literal if I tried. We're very excited to (finally!) break ground on the Miracle League field this year, the barrier-free ballfield from which the "Miracle" in Mundy Miracle Commons is derived. Mundy Township has also been uniquely successful in pursuing a variety of grant funding, making it possible to improve key infrastructure to enhance public safety, economic development opportunities, and overall quality of life. Nowhere will this be more evident in 2024 than the area of Hill Road immediately east of US-23. Mundy Township will be beginning approximately \$7-million dollars in public infrastructure projects funded by a combination of federal, state, county, and local grant dollars. And that's not taking into account the private development and construction taking place by LaFontaine and Costco now and into the future.

Finally, a word about local government listening and being responsive. It's a small example, but when it comes to the public services we're responsible for delivering, we here at Mundy Township set out on a daily basis striving to meet the expectations and needs of the community we serve. Last year, one area the board and administration heard (and loudly) needed improving was mosquito control. This is a service provided for in Mundy Township by voter approved property assessment. Now, mosquito control is no fool-proof endeavor, but we've heard the community input and made some changes for 2024 that we hope will lead to a more effective program. Please watch your mailboxes this spring for a brochure that will be sent to every property in the township for more information, and keep the input of how we can improve coming!

FROM THE TREASURER

Tax payment instructions are noted in the tax letter mailed to you with your tax bill and on the tax bill. Any partial summer or winter tax payments must be made at or mailed to the township administration office.

Summer 2023 tax balances are due with interest and payable to the township through 2/29/24. Summer payments must be made at or mailed to the township administration address: Treasurer's Office, 3478 Mundy Ave., Swartz Creek, MI 48473

Winter 2023 taxes are due at the township from 12/1/23 through 2/29/24. Postmarks are not accepted. Allow sufficient time for receipt of payment. ACH/EFT payments are not accepted. Total winter payments can be made at the township administration office or mailed to the PO Box/Dept# noted on the envelope provided on the tax bill and tax letter.

As of 3/1/24, pay personal property and qualified taxes at town-ship with interest and penalty. Pay all other real taxes at Genesee County Treasure's Office with interest and penalty.







The Mundy Township Fire Department hopes everyone had a good holiday season and wishes you and your family a "Fire Safe" new year. Let us help you be fire safe by installing smoke/CO and disability alarms at no cost to you. According to the Michigan Fire Inspectors Society, in 2023 there were more than 115 deaths caused by fires state-wide. In 52% of these fires, there were no working smoke alarms. In December, Mundy Township firefighters participated along with Metro Police at the 2023 Shop with a Hero event, sponsored by Meijer. Twenty children in need were treated to a holiday shopping spree with a firefighter and police officer. All involved had a great time. LEAVE YOUR FOOTPRINT AT THE COMMONS

Mundy Township is extremely proud of the efforts and partnerships that have been made to develop and support the Mundy Miracle Commons, the largest municipally owned and operated ADA/universal design park in Michigan. In addition to two miles of 10ft-wide paved paths, sledding hill, Japanese Garden, and meditation areas, we are currently building ADA bathrooms, a concessions space, and public pavilions. Further, this year we will be breaking ground on the barrier-free Miracle League ballfield for use by youth with disabilities who may have never been able to play ball before. We also have a vision for other future projects at the Commons, including an amphitheater, bocce ball, horse shoes, pickleball, exercise equipment, and the new home of our Senior and Enrichment Center.

All this has been dreamed and accomplished not just with township efforts and funding, but through significant contributions of public and private grants, bequests, and donations of varying sizes from individuals and institutions alike. And with the vision we have of a future in which the Commons becomes a regional public asset and destination, plenty of opportunities remain to contribute or donate and "Leave Your Footprint at the Commons."

Currently, we are promoting our **commemorative brick program** as an affordable way for supporters to help with beautification efforts and overhead costs. The Commons averages 300-500 people a day who would see your support, and donations to Mundy Township may be tax deductible. Other options to support the Commons currently include contributions towards benches, ADA picnic tables, memorial rose gardens, and the various facilities coming now and in the future. Or, if you have an idea for a different Footprint you might like to leave at Mundy Miracle Commons, we would be happy to meet with you and specialize an opportunity. For coming up on a year this spring, public interest has remained strong about an area in Mundy Township that has been identified as a target for possible development of an advanced manufacturing site through the acquisition of privately owned land. We would like to take this opportunity to again emphasize and reiterate that this potential advanced manufacturing development is not a townshipled effort, though we have engaged with various stakeholders to learn what we can and remain updated in as timely a manner as possible. Mundy Township still has not received any applications or proposals for construction or permitting of an advanced manufacturing project, nor are we aware of any imminently pending.

Mundy Township is excited about the economic opportunity that an advanced manufacturing site would present for the community, region, and state. The Township is a growing community that encourages responsible, sustainable investment and development, while striving to maintain the quality residential standards that have led to this area being one of the most desirable locations to establish a home.
