

RESOLUTION NO. 13-2021

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND RATIFYING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) FOR AN ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTER'S GRANT FOR 2021, AND IF AWARDED, ACCEPTING SUCH GRANT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City has been advised by FEMA through their Assistance to Firefighter's Grant Program that it is eligible to participate in a competitive application process; and

WHEREAS, the city of Olmsted Falls submitted an email application request on or about February 12, 2021, for funding to purchase an EagleAir BlackHawk Breathing Air Compressor in the amount of Fifty-Four Thousand Two Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars (\$54,257.00), requiring a city's participation of 5% of the cost in the sum of Two Thousand Seven Hundred Twelve Dollars and 85/100 (\$2,712.85). Now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. City Council adopts and ratifies the submittal of an application to FEMA, in the amount of Fifty-Four Thousand Two Hundred Fifty-Seven Dollars (\$54,257.00) from FEMA Assistance to Firefighter's Grant Program, to be used for the purchase of a EagleAir BlackHawk Breathing Air Compressor, requiring a city's participation of 5% of the cost in the sum of Two Thousand Seven Hundred Twelve Dollars and 85/100 (\$2,712.85), consistent with the terms of said grant application.

SECTION 2. That the Finance Director shall receive and account for said grant funds and shall administer said funds in compliance with the terms of the grant application and the laws of the State of Ohio and Ordinances of the City.

SECTION 3. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
