

ORDINANCE NO. 49-2021

INTRODUCED BY: Mayor James Graven and Council as a Whole

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE TO CERTIFY TO THE FISCAL OFFICER OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY UNPAID CHARGES AND/OR OTHER MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES APPLICABLE TO DELINQUENT OWNERS OF LAND FOR LEVY AND COLLECTION ACCORDING TO LAW, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. That the Director of Finance of the City of Olmsted Falls or his designee, be, and hereby is authorized and directed to certify to the Fiscal Officer of Cuyahoga County unpaid charges and penalty and/or other miscellaneous charges incurred by the City and directly related to the real property, which is due and unpaid for the premises plus penalty and interest, as of September 13, 2021 according to the schedule of delinquent accounts on file in the office of the Finance Director as of said date, said schedule to be attached to this Ordinance upon submission for certification to the County Fiscal Officer on or about September 13, 2021, all for placement and extension onto the tax duplicate of the affected parcels and for collection by the County Treasurer in the same manner as other taxes.

SECTION 2. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with all legal requirements, including without limitation, those set forth in Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Olmsted Falls for the reason to allow for a timely certification of delinquent accounts onto the tax duplicate for collection of funds needed for day to day operations of the City. Therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage by the affirmative vote of not less than five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
