

ORDINANCE NO. 04-2022

AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING CORY SWAISGOOD AS FINANCE DIRECTOR AND TAX ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION, AND REPEALING ALL LEGISLATION INCONSISTENT HEREWITH

WHEREAS, Cory Swaisgood meets all of the requirements of the Charter of the City to serve as the City's Finance Director; and

WHEREAS, in Ordinance 10-2021 (AMENDED) Council adopted a compensation range for the position of part-time Finance Director as \$35,000 to \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council desire to appoint Cory Swaisgood's professional services on a permanent part-time basis as the Finance Director for the City. Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. This Council hereby confirms the mayor's appointment of Cory Swaisgood as the Finance Director for the City effective January 1, 2022, and retroactive thereto.

SECTION 2. Finance Director Swaisgood said position shall be part time with no fringe benefits (except required OPERS and Medicare by employer and employee).

SECTION 3. All prior legislation inconsistent with this legislation, in whole or in part, is hereby repealed to the extent necessary to avoid conflict with this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Olmsted Falls for the reason that the legal services provided herein are needed for the current operation of the City government and, therefore, this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon the affirmative vote of not less than five
