

ORDINANCE NO. 09-2022

INTRODUCED BY: COUNCIL AS A WHOLE

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE APPOINTMENT AND THE COMPENSATION OF THE SAFETY DIRECTOR AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Mayor Jim Graven possess the skills, experience and expertise required for service as the city's Safety Director; and

WHEREAS, City Council in Ordinance 10-2021 (AMENDED), provides that, commencing January 1, 2021, a full time employee who also serves in a part time position, shall be compensated according to 50% of the compensation range of that particular part time position; and

WHEREAS, the compensation range for the part time position of Safety Director has been set by City Council in Ordinance 10-2021 (AMENDED) at \$5,000 to \$30,000; and

WHEREAS, City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City that Mayor Jim Graven shall also serve in the capacity as Safety Director, at the initial compensation range of \$15,000.00. Now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. Effective January 1, 2022, and retroactive thereto, the compensation to Mayor Jim Graven for his service as Safety Director of the Municipality shall be \$15,000.00 per annum.

SECTION 2. The Council hereby affirms the appointment of Mayor James Graven as Safety Director of the City effective as of January 1, 2022 and retroactive thereto.

SECTION 3. All prior legislation inconsistent with this legislation in whole or in part is hereby repealed to the extent necessary to avoid conflict with this legislation.

SECTION 4. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Olmsted Falls for the reason that the position of Safety Director has been assumed as of January 1, 2022 and continues in effect. Upon passage by the affirmative vote of not less than

five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law, this Ordinance shall take effect and be retroactively applied from January 1, 2022 and thereafter.
