

ORDINANCE NO. 63-2022

INTRODUCED BY: MAYOR JAMES GRAVEN

AN ORDINANCE APPOINTING MAX V. RIEKER AS DIRECTOR OF LAW FOR THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION, REPEALING ALL LEGISLATION INCONSISTENT HEREWITH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OLMSTED FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The appointment of Max V. Rieker, Esq. as “Director of Law” is effective January 16, 2023.

SECTION 2. The Compensation for the Director of Law shall be commensurate with the compensation paid for said position in fiscal year 2023 and not exceed the compensation range set forth in Ordinance #10-2021 (AMENDED) as adopted by council on October 26, 2021. All of the Director of Law’s compensation shall be subject to contribution by the City and Director of Law to Ohio Public Employees Retirement System and is subject to payroll deductions. Duties of the Director of Law shall consist of various routine matters which shall include:

- (i) Responsibility for protecting the legal interests of the City and carrying out the duties set out in Section 9.05 of the Charter of the City and Chapter 232 of the Codified Ordinances;
- (ii) Attending all regular and special Council meetings, except as otherwise directed by the Mayor;
- (iii) Drafting ordinances and resolutions upon the request of the Mayor or Council;
- (iv) Researching and drafting legal memoranda as requested by the Mayor or Council;
- (v) Providing legal advice to City officials as necessary;
- (vi) Attending meetings and discussions with City, County, State, and Federal officials, as requested;
- (vii) Reviewing and approving contracts, ordinances, resolutions, and any other written documents, as requested by the Mayor or Council.

SECTION 3. The Director of Law, along with the personnel in his law firm of Weston Hurd who he chooses to assist, shall receive additional compensation for legal services performed outside the scope of routine matters which, for example purposes, shall include the following: litigation and appeals, non-city administrative hearings and appeals, collective bargaining labor negotiations, and/or other major projects that may be assigned by the Mayor or Council from time to time, at the various rates stated in Exhibit “A” attached.

SECTION 4. The Director of Law shall not receive any of the following benefits: sick time, holidays, vacation, personal days, funeral leave, and longevity.

SECTION 5. All prior legislation inconsistent with this legislation in whole or in part is hereby repealed to the extent necessary to avoid conflict with this legislation.

SECTION 6. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Olmsted Falls for the reason that the legal services provided herein are needed for the current operation of the City government and, therefore, this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon the affirmative vote of not less than five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
