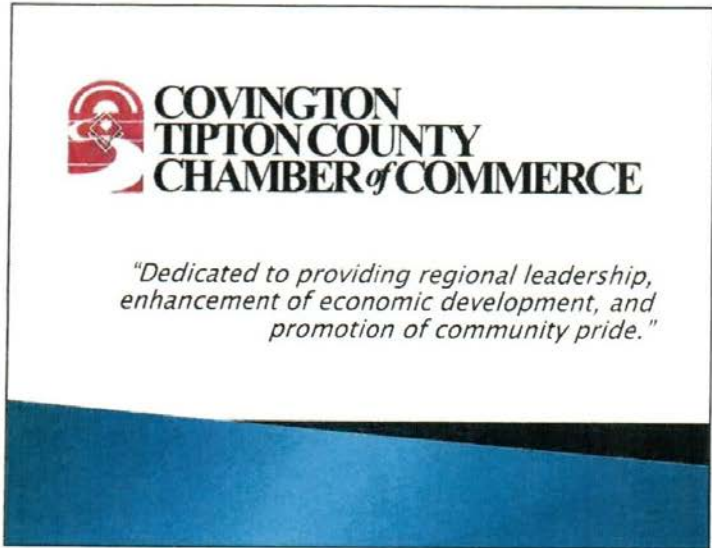

The meeting was opened with prayer by Commissioner Shopher.





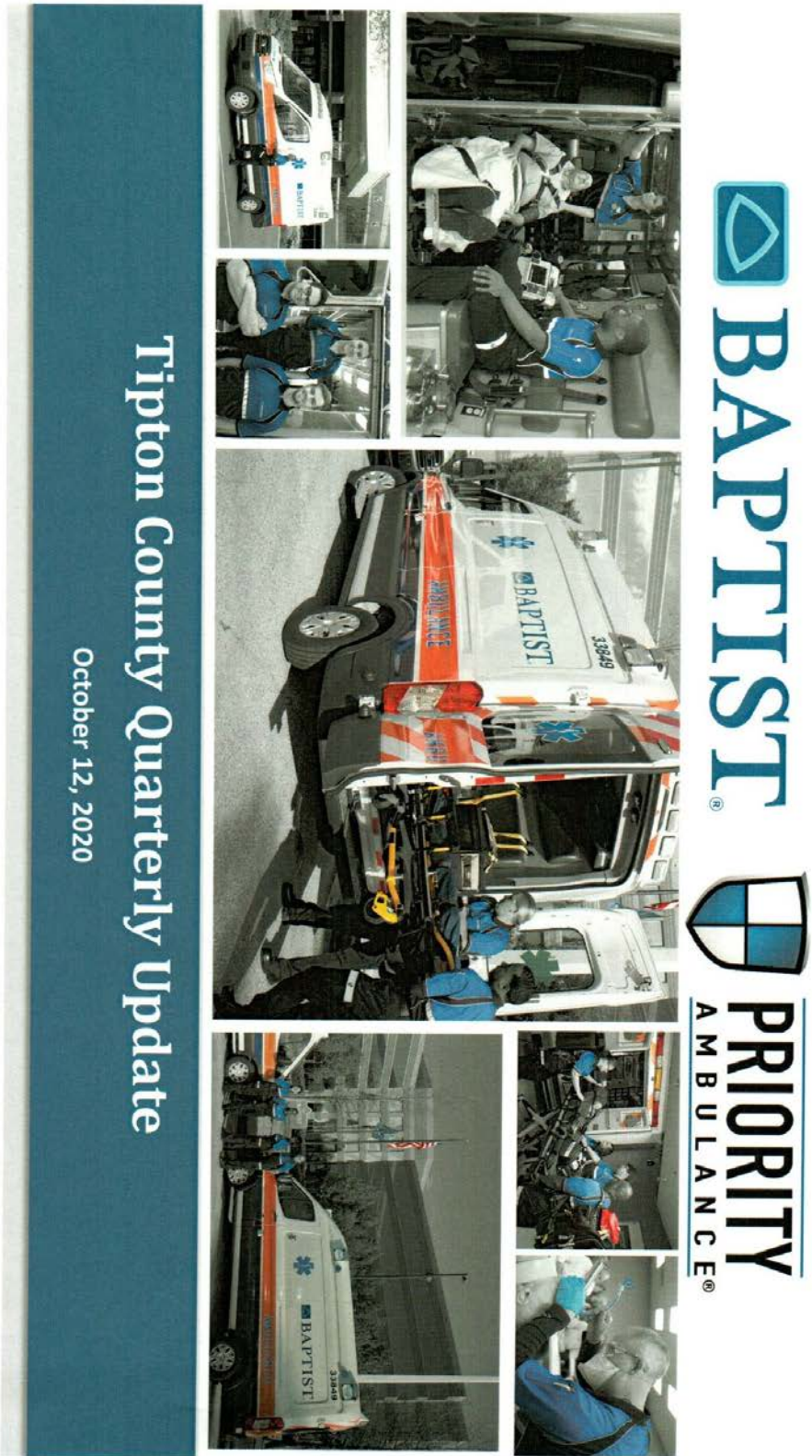
Chairman Bob Wilson called the meeting to order and established that a quorum was present.

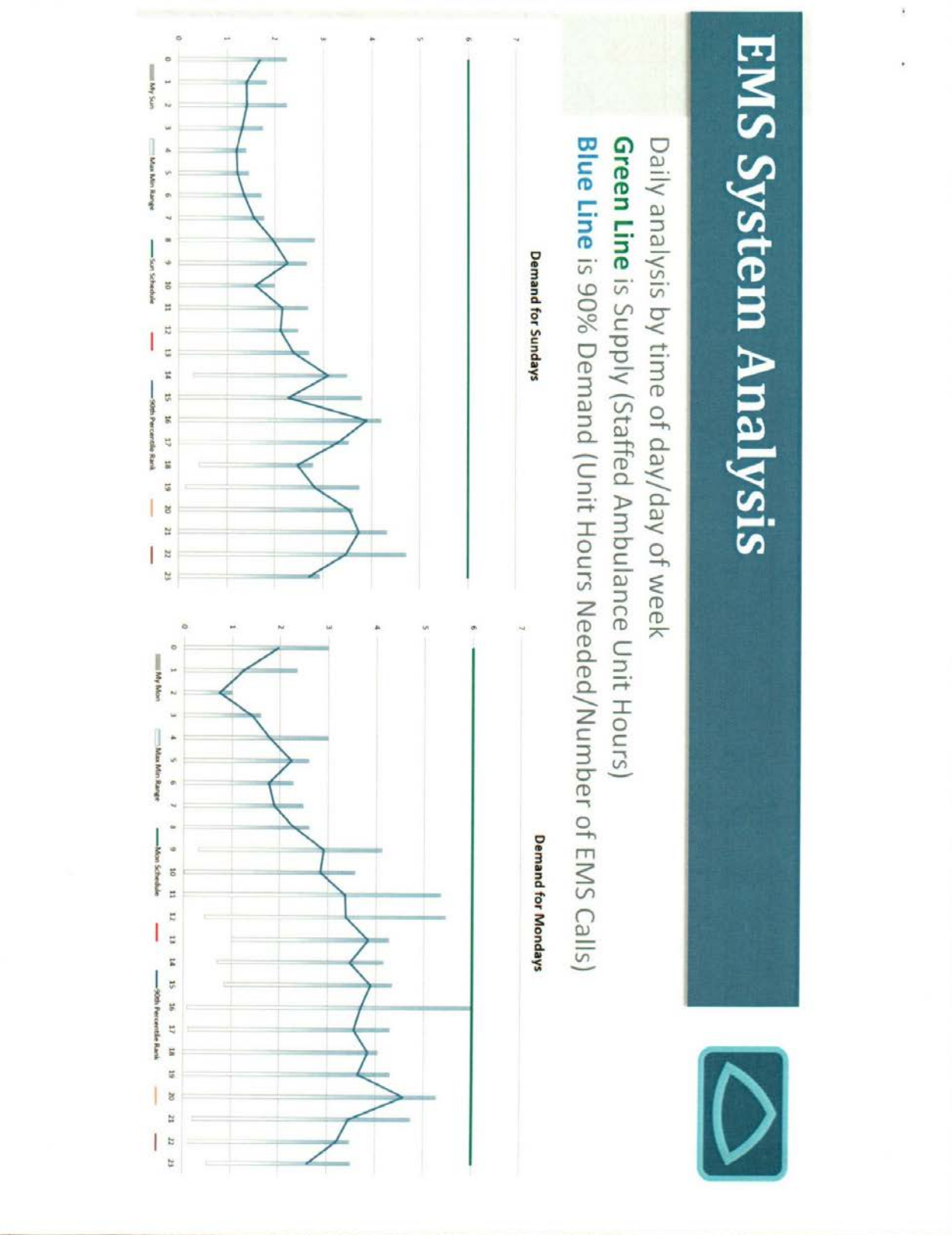

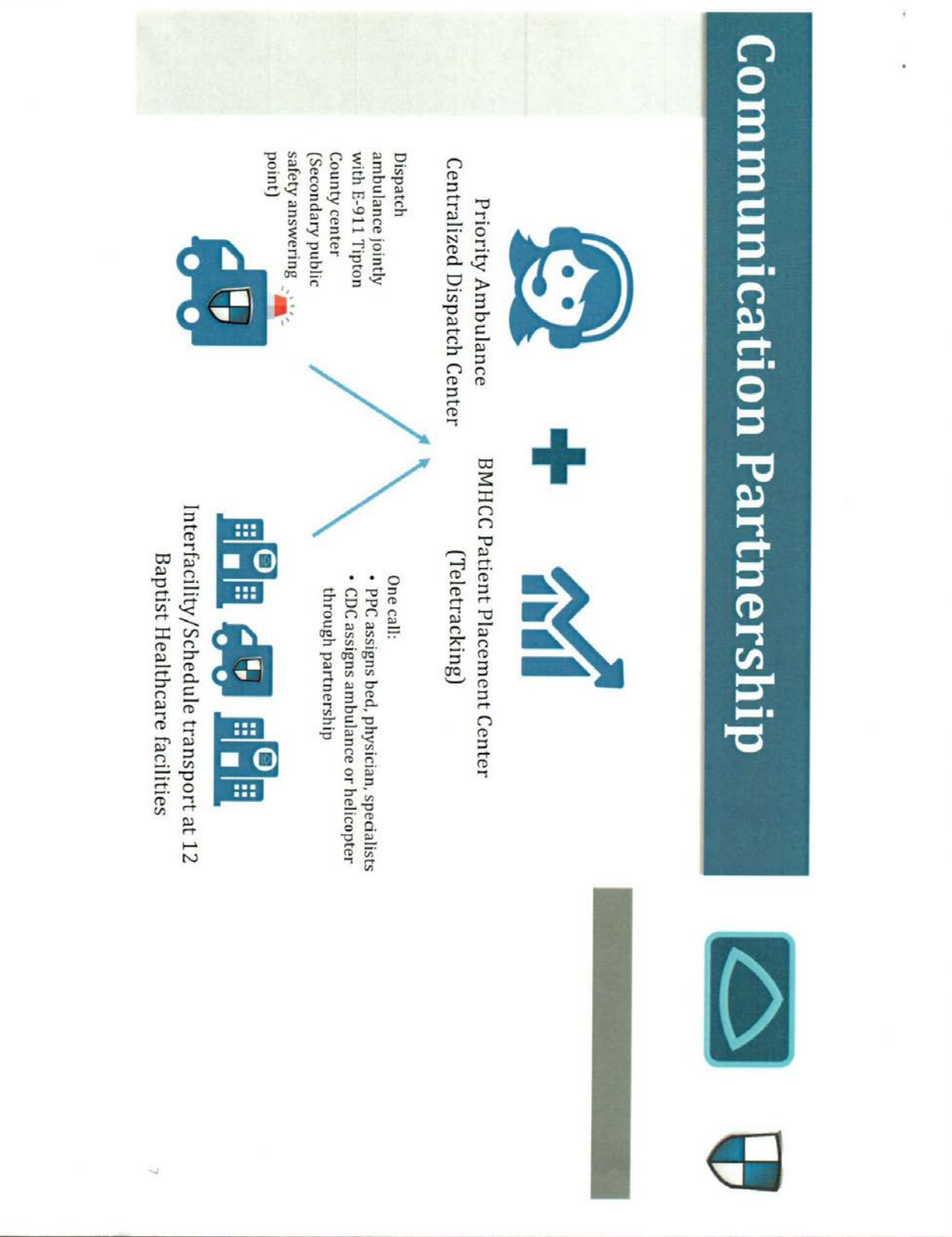

**Significant Activity**

**01-04 September-** Lieutenant Eddie Walker and Sergeant Bradley Williams attended 24 hours of Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD) training conducted by the Tennessee Public Safety Network. The certified training, was conducted in Dickson County at the onsite facility in Cumberland Furnace, Tennessee. The residential training was conducted by Peter Cove and other members of the Tennessee Public Safety Network. The program is designed to help participants understand a wide range of crisis intervention services including pre and post incident crisis education, significant other support services, on-scene support services, crisis intervention for individuals, demobilizations after large scale traumatic incidents, among others. A critical incident is any event that is outside the typical range of experience for a person; and has sufficient impact in that it overwhelms the persons usual effective coping abilities. Typical critical incidents would include, but not limited to: Line-of-duty deaths, deadly force incidents, and serious line-of-duty injuries to self or co-workers, to name a few.

**5 September-** The Tipton County Sheriff’s Office recently conducted an undercover alcohol compliance check on several Tipton County businesses over the Labor Day weekend. Investigators utilized an informant, under the age of 21, to go into these establishments in an attempt to purchase alcohol. Throughout the investigation, a total of fourteen businesses were checked. Thirteen of those businesses refused to sell to the underage informant however, one business did sell. Dollar General, located at 7031 Highway 14 South in Brighton, was the only business that was in violation. Cited for the unlawful sale was employee, Marissa Ward (21), of Millington, TN. Ward is due in General Sessions court on October 6th, 2020.

**14-24 September-** Detectives Tonia Bruno and Daniel Jacobs attended the 2020 TBI City/County Crime Investigation School in Bell Buckle, TN. The school is 71.5 hours of post certified training. The curriculum included Terrorism and Law Enforcement, Basic Fire Investigations, Interview and Interrogation (with emphasis on Sex Abuse), Human Trafficking, Drug Diversion, Search & Seizure Warrants, Photography, Documenting Crime Scenes, Homicide Investigations, Latent Prints, Forensic Biology, Microanalysis, and Crime Scene investigations.

**16 September-** Captain Chris Williams, Detective Mark Daugherty, and Detective Jay Rodriguez attended the Child Protective Investigative Team (CPIT) meeting via conference call due to Covid-19 protocol. Eleven cases involving fifteen victims were reviewed. All eleven cases involved child sexual abuse. Three cases will be brought back for review, four cases were classified as Accusation Substantiated, one case was closed due to jurisdiction (Mississippi), one case was classified as Child with sexual Behavior Problems (CSB), two cases occurred in Weakley and Fayette County.

**17 September-** Chief Deputy Billy Daugherty and Detective Tyler Huelsing attended the Drug Free Tipton (DFT) meeting via Zoom. Topics were discussed is as follows:

- Tobacco, Vaping, and Marijuana classes
- Law Enforcement Against Drugs (LEAD) and scheduling with schools
- Drive-by take back at Cobb Parr Park on Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup> from 11am to 1pm, covered the protocol and requested 3-4 volunteers to assist
- Compliance check revealed that Sheriff’s Office had one store in violation of underage sales out of 14 stores
- Restoration Church donated \$500 to Drug Free Tipton
- Business cards to be handed out to families on overdose deaths
- Mental Health Awareness class offered on Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> via Zoom
- September 24<sup>th</sup> requesting 22 volunteers to do 22 push-ups to recognize Veterans Suicide Awareness

**17 September-** Lieutenants Daniel Walls and Eddie Walker attended a security assessment meeting at Drummonds Elementary led by Glenn Turner.

**18 September -** The Sheriff’s Office’s new hires began the training program, which is conducted by Sheriff’s Office personnel. Tyler Hobbs, Tommy Chapman, Dallas Burns, and Kyle Williams were hired to fill vacancies in the Corrections Division.

**19 September –** Captain Chris Williams attended the Vulnerable Adult Protective Investigation Team (VAPIT) meeting, where thirty-one cases (twenty-nine victims) were discussed. Of those, ten cases were neglect (ten victims); seven cases were physical abuse (six victims); two cases were emotional abuse (two victims); eleven cases were financial exploitation (ten victims); one case was sexual abuse (one victim).
