## **BOARD OF HEALTH MEETING MINUTES**

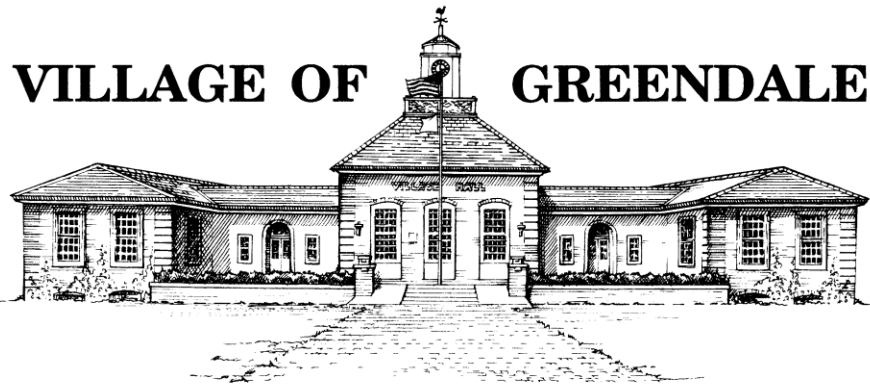
**DATE:** March 16, 2021

  - a. **Medical Advisor Report:** No update.
  - b. **Trustee Report:** J. Cyborowski shared that he was concerned about two recent Greendale deaths related to opioid overdoses. S. Sheppard informed members that there has been a recent increase in opioid deaths in Milwaukee County during the Pandemic. M. Mohiuddin and P. The Village of Greendale has a Drug-Free Community grant which has a focus on youth substance misuse prevention. Madeline Kornbeck is the coalition's coordinator and will be notified of this discussion.
  - c. **Health Officer Report:** S. Sheppard, Health Officer reviewed the February Board of Health Report. The Health Department continues to implement the continuity of operations plan during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Board of Health format has been shortened as most of the Health Department's work now is focused on COVID-19. However, several of the CHIP workgroups continue to meet and work on activities. The SAGE committee will be creating a SAGE Page to insert in the Village Views. The SAGE Page will include resources for older adults and their families. A sub-committee of SAGE successfully wrote a Village of Greendale application in order to join the Dementia Friendly America Network. This sub-committee partnered with the Greendale Library and the Department on Aging to provide an April 14<sup>th</sup> virtual session on "What Makes You a Dementia Friend". Additional educational sessions are planned for 2021.

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#### **8. OLD/ONGOING BUSINESS:**

- a. Coronavirus (COVID-10) status update: S. Sheppard shared there is very helpful information on key indicators, testing, cases, vaccine data on the Milwaukee County Dashboard. Here is a link to the dashboard: <https://county.milwaukee.gov/EN/Office-of-Emergency-Management>

S. Sheppard reviewed the information in the handouts “COVID-19 in our Area” and “COVID-19 Data from February 2021”. Approximately 77% of our older adults, 65+ years of age have already received at least one dose of the COVID vaccine. The Greendale Fire Department is in the process of working out the details to provide the COVID vaccine to homebound individuals in Greendale. We are extremely fortunate to have a wonderful group of community volunteers and paid, limited term staff assisting with the vaccine clinics. We have collaborated successfully several times with the National Guard as that organization can provide support staff.

We collaborated with Zone D health departments (Franklin, Greenfield, Hales Corners, Greendale) and plan to offer large scale vaccine clinics at the Franklin Sports Complex beginning 3/17/2021. There is no charge to use the facility. Nursing students from Marquette University and Alverno College will be assisting with the clinics. Beginning 3/29/2021, individuals 16 and older with certain medical conditions will be eligible to receive the COVID vaccine.

The Health Department purchased a generator which will provide backup for our vaccine refrigerator and freezer in case of electricity loss. The generator was purchased with COVID-19 grant money.

- b. Update on Community Health Improvement Planning:  
S. Sheppard shared the Greendale Community Health Summit meeting agenda. The summit will be held march 24<sup>th</sup>, 9 am to 12 pm over Zoom. The summit goal is to select the health priorities that the Greendale Health Department will focus on in the next 5 years. Please let K. Mannebach know if you would like to participate.
