Communicable Diseases

- Flu Vaccine Orders placed for 2022-2023,
- Wisconsin is doing [Wastewater Surveillance for COVID-19](#), and there has been a decrease in the presence of SARS-CoV-2 in our area.
- Coordinated a COVID-19 testing plan for Martin Luther High School students and chaperones traveling out of state for choir and band performances.
- Received funding to support 12-week paid internship for MPH student focusing on access to covid19 vaccines.

Chronic Disease

- We were granted a mini grant from AARP for \$1000 to conduct 3 sessions to support intergenerational bonding to promote mental resiliency. This was a project our MCW student is doing for her capstone project and now she has the experience of submitting a grant application and getting awarded funding for her project!!
- Two successful student/staff presentations at Martin Luther High School were held with Philip Chard, a national speaker and psychotherapist on the topic of anxiety and social media use. (600 students attended the presentations.

Maternal Child Health

- Received [Ages and Stages Questionnaire- Social Emotional training](#) from Wisconsin Children's Health Alliance.
 - School district early childhood staff attended with us, and Wisconsin Children's Health Alliance gifted both the health department and school district ASQ-SE kits to conduct screenings with parents and children.
 - -ASQ-SE helps identify any social-emotional challenges and provides activities to improve SE development.
- Staff is already trained in [ASQ-3- childhood development screening](#).
- Our objective for this grant area this year will be to increase the use of ASQ screening in the community.
