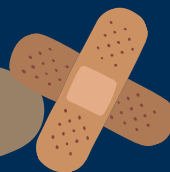

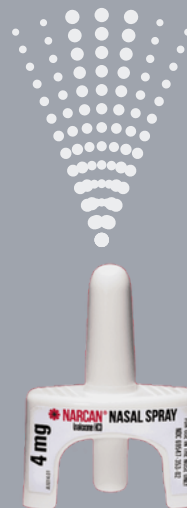
114 flu vaccines were given between 10/31 and 11/30 as part of our annual flu clinic event.
