Communicable Diseases

- We continue to hold weekly COVID booster clinics and continue to collaborate with all the schools and long-term care facilities on COVID case isolation and quarantine recommendations.
- Supplied other village departments with masks, cleaning supplies, etc.
- Offered rapid COVID testing for village staff.
- Communicated with Greendale Schools re: COVID and updated CDC isolation and quarantine guidelines.
 - Attended school board meeting to provide any clarification on current recommendations.
- FDA approved booster dose for 12-15 years old. Hayat pharmacy and GSD held booster dose clinics for 12+. GHD provided staffing support.

CHIP workgroups

- The Dementia-Friendly workgroup: I was invited to participate in a rapid strategic planning process with the Alzheimer's Association and the National Association of County and City Health Organizations.
- Mental Health/Resiliency initiative: The Greendale Health Department is working with a graduate student from the Medical College of Wisconsin for her final project. Her goal is to promote intergenerational bonding to improve mental resiliency

Community Outreach

- Greendale Lions Club held an N95 mask drive through distribution at GHS on Saturday 1/29. They gave out almost 3000 masks.
- 15000 masks were given away in the community through GHD, GPD, and the library last week.

Community Alliance

- The Teen Team had their quarterly meeting on January 17th. They created a social media "bingo board" to share on Random Acts of Kindness Day on February 17th.
- Community Alliance had their quarterly whole coalition meeting on the 19th. Members worked on some upcoming events including:

 - Exit plans for families
- Hosted virtual teen focus groups regarding perceptions about marijuana, facilitated by a UW-Milwaukee Zilber School of Public Health MPH student.
