## Communicable Disease

- Greendale Health Department has discontinued the **individual case investigations** for those who test positive for COVID-19 as of 6/30/22. Residents who test positive or who have questions about COVID-19 are still always welcome to call us to receive information and guidance. The objective moving forward is to place focus at the community level.
  - Stay home if sick and consider [getting tested](#) for COVID-19, wash your hands frequently, cover your coughs and sneezes, wear a mask when [community level](#) is considered “[high](#)”. If you test positive, speak with your healthcare provider to determine if you would be a good fit for [COVID-19 treatment](#).
- Public health staff monitored information about the presence of [Monkeypox in Wisconsin](#) and discussed plans with other healthcare providers and public health professionals.

  - [Healthy Minds, Healthy Greendale](#) promoted **mental health and wellness** on one side of our table and one of our Public Health Nurse promoted healthy **child development** with a fun activity and prizes, while highlighting that our health department offers free [child developmental screenings](#).

  - [SAGE](#) organized an **Older Adult Health Screening and Resource Fair** that was held at the St. Al’s community room with over 90 attendees!
  - Free health screenings were available and experts from area agencies, business, and organizations, who are dedicated to older adult health and wellness were available to discuss information on a wide range of topics.

- Cebrin Goodman Teen Institute Conference
