Our Village Departments have been busy welcoming new staff and wishing retiring staff the very best as they move into the next chapter of their lives. In addition, many Greendale staff have recently celebrated impressive anniversaries with the Village, from 10 to 25 years of service. Congratulations, everyone!

RETIRING STAFF

Kristen Victory, Finance Director/Treasurer

We congratulate Kristen Victory on her retirement after 10 years with the Village of Greendale. Kristen joined the Village in 2012 as Deputy Treasurer, coming over from the City of West Allis. She was promoted to Clerk/Treasurer in 2014 and then became Finance Director/Treasurer in 2020. Her last day was on February 1.

"I am most proud of the efficiencies that have been created during my time here," Victory notes. During her tenure, the Village implemented more efficient options for transactions, such as online water payment system, automatic ACH payments and remote deposits. The Village began using the State Debt Collection Agency that significantly increased collections of delinquent accounts owed to the Village. Improvements were also made to streamline processes for journal entries, budgeting and financial reporting.

These improvements helped free up time for other Village Hall staff to take on additional tasks, such as Public Works administrative work, additional ambulance billing duties, printing and stuffing tax bills in-house, and other special projects (like the water meter replacement project).

"I have enjoyed serving my community these past 10 years and will miss the amazing staff that I have worked with during this time," says Victory. "Village staff is comprised of many dedicated individuals working hard to do their best for the Village. I am proud to have been a part of it!"

Community Alliance and Greendale Schools Partner On a Family Wellness Event

A Family Wellness Event was held on Tuesday, February 7, that was the result of a partnership between Community Alliance and the Greendale School District. This event was free and open to the public, and widely promoted within the community as well as the Greater Milwaukee area.

Mr. Weber's 8th grade Healthy Choices class created poster presentations to share topics related to mental health and substance misuse during the event. There were 30 small groups of students – more than 100 students total – who helped create these posters and then presented on Tuesday night to share the information gathered with the community.

Along with the 8th grade students, 16 vendors from Greendale, Hales Corners and Franklin exhibited at the event to share resources and giveaways for those in attendance. Vendors ranged from non-profits to local businesses and other community resources, such as the Health Department and Police Departments. Community members had the chance to enter a family game night

drawing by each of the vendors and as many of the 8th grade presentations they were able to that night.

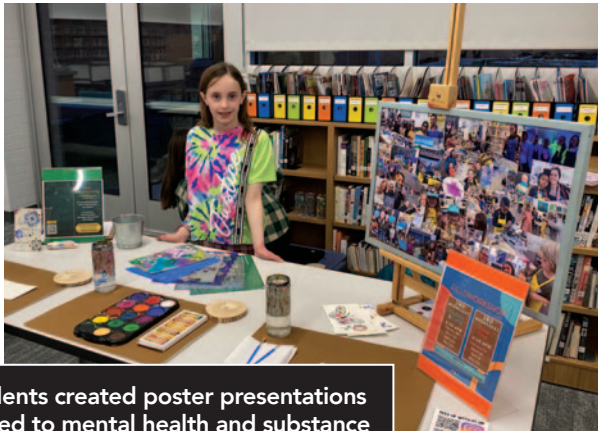
After poster presentations, everyone was encouraged to meet national speaker and author, Joe Beckman. Mr. Beckman did schoolwide presentations on February 6, 7 and 8, reaching students at Whitnall Middle and High School, Greendale Middle and High School, and Franklin High School. Although presentations between grade levels and families were different, they all related to promoting human connectedness. Mr. Beckman emphasized the importance of relationship-forming and dealing with situations using a love-first approach.

Greendale Health Department Receives Healthy Brain Initiative Award

The Greendale Health Department is a 2023 recipient of a Healthy Brain Initiative (HBI) award! This award, presented by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Alzheimer's Association and the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) will allow the Health Department to increase its ability to address brain health through the lifespan and dementia of our community. Through this work, the Health Department will continue working toward brain health equity.

"We know those living with dementia and their caregivers have varying levels of needs, including cognitive, behavioral and physical needs. As we work to connect those affected with resources and support, we also hope that this intentional approach to integrating brain health as early and as often as possible will positively impact our community and help us reach our vision of, 'Healthiest and Happiest Greendale'," explains Ashley Haas MPA, BSN, RN, Greendale Public Health Director.

Did you know that 40 percent of dementia cases could be prevented by having healthy habits?

The science on dementia-risk reduction is quickly evolving, and reducing the risk for dementia at an earlier age is the emerging focus. The evidence showing a link between certain behaviors/conditions and dementia is growing stronger.

The most important health habits that may reduce the risk of dementia include:

- Getting regular physical activity.
- Quitting smoking or never starting.
- Being heart-healthy, which includes regular blood pressure screening, eating a healthy diet and maintaining a healthy weight.

As a first step, the Health Department, with assistance from Maggy Olson of Greendale Schools, hosted a summit for health equity and brain health. The goal of the summit was to educate and empower current Health Department committee members to become health equity and brain health ambassadors in Greendale.

"Health equity and brain health are two of the Health Department's strategic priorities moving forward, and we plan to infuse these strategies into our current work as well as with new programs," offers Megan Mermal, Public Health Specialist and HBI Strategist. Health Department committee members assist in addressing the health priority areas in Greendale, those being: mental health, successful aging, substance misuse, and physical activity and nutrition.

Over the past several years the Greendale Health Department, SAGE and other partners have been working hard to identify and implement ways that Greendale can become more age- and dementia-friendly. A significant success was the acceptance of Greendale into the Dementia Friendly America network. As a dementia-friendly community, we continue to work with community partners, engage persons with dementia and their caregivers, and collaborate with other agencies to lead and shape our dementia-friendly activities, programs and events.

Congratulations again to the Greendale Health Department for earning this national award. This great accomplishment is the direct result of hard work and dedication. The Healthy Brain Initiative will open up many opportunities and resources to impact the Greendale community.

Walking Path Audit Leads the Way To More Rest Stops and Signage Develop Deeper Appreciation of Greendale's Walking Trails

Welcome to the Village of Greendale, a historic Greenbelt Town designed as a vibrant and walkable community with a bustling historic downtown surrounded by beautiful tree-lined neighborhoods.

Our community boasts convenient and accessible amenities, green spaces and parks, walking paths, bike paths, excellent schools, quality service departments, a variety of churches, and many Village events.

Since the incorporation of Greendale in 1938, to the present – 85 years later – we would agree with an important woman in Greendale history, Eleanor Roosevelt, who reported back to President Roosevelt, in 1936, that “the Village was laid out beautifully.” A significant part of Greendale’s original design included the creation of a pedestrian path network, providing the community with a reliable mode of transportation and an opportunity for social interaction. These paths are well-used and continue to be an important part of Greendale’s unique identity.

In 2018, with the help from several community groups including SAGE (Successful Aging in Greendale for Everyone), Step Up to Better Health, Love Thy Neighbor Foundation and Girl Scout Troop 8035, a “walking path audit” was completed to evaluate our walking paths and accessibility for all community members. Two common observations were made: the need for more rest stops and the need for more directional signage at some of the pathway crossings.

Later that year, the group of community members submitted a proposal for funding from AARP and were awarded with funds for 6 new rest stop benches and 10 directional signs. In 2019, the Greendale Health Department,

Greendale Department of Public Works and the Greendale Women’s Club helped to complete this project by providing the installation of signs and benches along our walking paths – and the creation and printing of new updated walking maps. The walking maps have 10 color-coded walking routes with varying distances. Did you know there are more than 50 miles of walking paths in Greendale?

The walking paths aren’t the only way to get out and explore beautiful Greendale, especially now as the weather warms up. Below is a list of ideas to jumpstart your journey and get you started exploring our Village.

- The Village is also connected to the Milwaukee County Oak Leaf Trail, which provides additional opportunities for walking, running, or biking. Do you know where the Oak Leaf Trail is? If not, we encourage you to explore and enjoy the trails.
- Take a stroll around Scout Lake and the connecting paths. As the snow melts, consider bringing a trash bag or two to help pick up trash that has been blown around over the winter. Remember, being a good neighbor includes picking up after your pet during walks, too!
- So many benefits – physical activity, fresh air, nature and community service are good for our health, our pets’ health, and our environment’s health as well!
- Further help beautify our Village, Daffodil Park and Dale Creek area on Clean and Green Day, Saturday morning, May 20.

- Don't forget to stop by the Greendale Children's Garden and see what the garden is growing this year. Walk by often throughout the season to watch the garden grow!

May Is Bike Safety Month

- Create a goal to learn more about pedestrian and bike safety, and ways you can be safer when you are out and about our Village.
- Watch for more information about free reflective pedestrian safety vests available in Greendale later this Spring.
- Get properly fitted with a high-quality, low-cost bike helmet at the Greendale Health Department.

- Plan your Saturday morning walking route down to Broad Street for this summer's Downtown Market, held from 8 a.m.-12 p.m. starting June 3. The market is a wholesome gathering place for people of all ages that builds community, feeds people, and supports small farms, producers and businesses.

- Enjoy viewing and hearing the story about more than 200 decorated chimneys on our "Originals," as well as

other historical facts and stories during a one-hour walking tour of the Historic Village of Greendale during a Historic & Folk Art Chimney Tour (driving tours also available).

- Don't forget to put the 27th Annual Garden Walk on your summer calendar. Held Saturday, July 8, from 8 a.m.-12 p.m. the Walk starts at the Gazebo and goes through the "A" section.

- Embrace the sunshine and check out our 12 parks/playgrounds! Can you identify all 12?

- Autumn provides another opportunity to participate with others in the community while raising funds for Greendale Schools and getting active at the same time at the Step Up Fun Run/Walk on Sunday, October 22.

ROLLING OUT THE ROYAL BLUE CARPET

MATC Baseball and Softball Teams Will Play on New Turf Field at OC Campus This Spring

Milwaukee Area Technical College has dreamed about a field like this for more than a decade.

For years, the MATC baseball team played on a natural grass field at the college's Oak Creek Campus on South Howell Ave.

Located on the west side of the campus, the field was subjected to the whims of Wisconsin weather – with its wet, cold and even snowy springs – making meaningful maintenance almost impossible and severely limiting the number of practices and games.

"Keeping the grass field in shape was very intensive," says Travis Mrozek, MATC's assistant athletic director. "Special clay and sand were required, and there was a lot of watering and fertilizing needed. If you got just a little rain, the field would feel like a sponge. There would be standing water and players could get hurt playing on it like that."

"With the winters and springs we often got, we were lucky to play four or five dates in a season," Mrozek adds. "When that happens, that doesn't help recruit students. Kids will go where they can play, plain and simple."

This spring, the Stormers have a brand new place to play and call home. MATC's baseball and softball teams plan to play all their home games at an artificial turf field at the Oak Creek Campus, Mrozek says.

"There's a real excitement to start using it," he says.

After a feasibility study showed the benefits of a turf field, the project was added to the college's three-year facilities plan in June 2020. The \$2.2 million project included covering the entire field with bright green turf outlined in dark blue, erecting a new scoreboard, constructing new dugouts, and adding new bullpens and batting cages, Mrozek says.

MATC paid for \$1.5 million of the project, and a \$700,000 water retention grant from the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District covered the remaining costs.

MATC also had to get permission from Boise State University to install colored turf on the field, Mrozek says. Boise State, famous for its deep blue turf football field, owns the trademark on using any type of colored artificial surface.

So far, the new field is a hit.

"We're very excited about the season, and we're very

fortunate to have these facilities," says Caleb Bounds, MATC's new baseball coach who was hired last July.

"I think we're going to have a very competitive team, and we have a real shot to win a lot of games."

Thanks to the new turf field, Bounds says he had to cancel only one practice in the fall because of bad weather. "We actually went on it and practiced after it rained," he says. "To have a unique field, to be able to practice every day, to get out there earlier and to play more games are big selling points to students we're recruiting."

"Players in the Midwest understand the weather," Bounds adds. "We also know it's not just us who are affected. But thanks to this field, we'll be able to play more than other teams and that will only help us achieve our goals."

Also, having the turf field will save the college between \$20,000 and \$30,000 in annual maintenance, Mrozek says.

The baseball team played one game on the turf field last season – a playoff game on May 12, 2022. While waiting for the turf to be delivered and installed, the team played home games at the Rock Complex in Franklin and at Henry Aaron Field in Glendale. "Essentially they were nomads," Mrozek says. "They were a team without a home, yet they still had a very successful season."

Under previous head coach Zac Charbonneau, the Stormers finished with an overall record of 34-18-1 and were 5-4-1 in conference play. They won two games at the NJCAA Region IV Tournament before being eliminated. In 2021, the Stormers finished 19-17 – their first season with a winning record in at least 10 years.

The baseball team opened the 2023 season on February 25 at North Arkansas College in Harrison, Arkansas. After eight games down south, MATC is slated to play a doubleheader against Kishwaukee College on Friday, March 10, at the new field.

"There is something to having a home, playing at your own campus, playing on a field that has your name on it and that has your colors on it," Mrozek says. "For us, it's a real home field."

NEW SEASON, NEW COACHES

Milwaukee Area Technical College will have some new faces in the dugout this spring.

Caleb Bounds is the new Stormers baseball coach. He was hired last July to replace Zac Charbonneau, who left for the University of Wisconsin-Parkside after four seasons. Joe Kuntner is the college's new softball head coach.

Bounds previously coached at Rock Valley College in Rockford, Illinois, helping the Golden Eagles to the lowest ERA in program history. "He's a great fit," says MATC Athletic Director Randy Casey. "He's got a junior college background and he has a wealth of experience as a player and a coach, and is bringing that experience to us."

Before working at Rock Valley, Bounds coached at Columbia College, an NAIA college in Columbia, Missouri, and was also the head coach of the Chillicothe Mudcats of the MINK (Missouri, Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas) Summer League. Bounds played baseball at William Woods University and at North Central Missouri College.

Kuntner comes to MATC with 22 years of coaching experience as a head and assistant coach at the college, high school, club and little league levels. For the last four years, Kuntner has been the recruiting coordinator at Delta Sports Performance Center. During that time he helped place four softball players at the NCAA Division I level, and more than 20 players at the college level. "We are excited to welcome Joe Kuntner to the MATC family," Casey says. "He is a great fit for our program. His coaching and recruiting experiences provide us a chance to be successful."

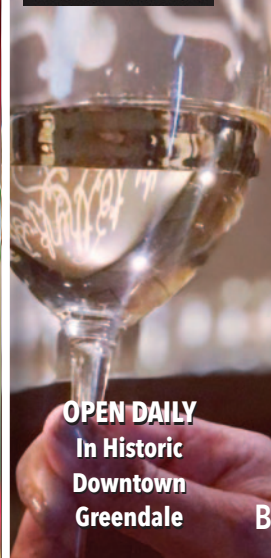

Greendale High School Game Day LIVE!: TEAM BRINGS HOME THE SILVER!

Amid claps and cheers from friends and family awaiting their arrival, more than 70 Greendale High School students returned home with Silver Medals after competing in the Universal Cheerleaders Association (UCA) National High School Cheerleading Championships in Orlando, Florida, in mid-February. These students, members of Greendale's Varsity Cheer (GVC) Team and the State-Champion Greendale Band's Pep Band, earned second place honors in the Game Day LIVE! division of the cheerleading competition. This was the inaugural competition for this division at the high school level.

The Game Day LIVE! division combines the efforts of cheerleading and live music from the pep band. It focuses on crowd-leading ability, execution, energy and overall performance to excite the crowd in the stands in support of their school and athletes. The routine starts with the band playing a one-minute song

choreographed in a routine similar to what a marching band might perform at halftime of a football game. The cheerleaders then join the band and perform a routine to a song the band plays in the stands during a game.

When an announcer calls out a situation that might occur in the game (whether the football team is on defense or offense), Cheer and Pep Band react to the situational call out with a chant that the fans would cheer along with. Teams are then judged on a crowd-leading cheer that the Band and Color Guard joined using rally towels and flags to enhance the cheer. The three-minute routine ends with the Pep Band, Color Guard and Cheerleaders performing our school Fight Song. To end the performance, Greendale's Pep Band played "On Wisconsin."

"Last year at Nationals, I attended the Game Day LIVE! competition to see what it was all about," remembers Greendale Varsity Cheer Coach Tina Zamjahn. "I thought it was so much fun to watch and immediately thought

it would be a great fit for our cheer and band programs in Greendale."

Mrs. Zamjahn returned home with videos and information about the competition. After enthusiastic conversations with Greendale's Band Director Tom Reifenberg and Athletic and Activities Director Jerad Galante, a decision was made to proceed with selecting music and developing a routine for competition.

"GVC began working on its part of the routine in the fall," Mrs. Zamjahn explains. "Pep Band jumped into our Game Day routine in mid-December after Marching Band and winter concerts were done for the year."

The Game Day team held weekly practices and performed its routine at home basketball games and in exhibition at local competitions before heading to Nationals. According to UCA rules, each group needed to submit a performance on video for review and judging. The Cheer Team was also required to perform its routine in person at a qualifying Regional Competition. Both teams easily

received bids for nationals. GVC also received a bid to compete in the traditional routine category. The Greendale squad finished 10th in the nation in this portion of the competition.

The benefits of collaborating in this routine are many, according to Mrs. Zamjahn. "It was great to learn more about each other's program and to appreciate the skills it took from both groups to bring a routine together," she notes. "We were unsure how this was going to work and both groups had to trust each other that each group would bring their all to the routine."

"It was very much out of the Pep Band's comfort zone to perform cheer moves. The Cheer Team absolutely loved the excitement of live music and how great our band kids are at playing.

It was so much fun to work together," Mrs. Zamjahn adds.

Tom Reifenberg continues, "Students from both organizations now have a better understanding and appreciation for what each other brings to the GHS game day experience. It was incredible to provide two successful GHS groups with the opportunity to see each other's 'world' and how each group works extremely hard at their craft."

"We went into this division with little knowledge, yet we scored just 1.65 points from the first place team," Mrs. Zamjahn explains. "We learned a lot from this experience and hope to join forces again in the future."

Greendale Schools Welcome GHS Grad As Medical Advisor

GHS alumna Sarah (Bly) Yale, M.D. is returning to Greendale in a new role. A graduate of the Class of 2006, Dr. Yale was recently approved by the Board of Education as the Greendale Schools' Medical Advisor.

State statute requires that each school district provides a medical advisor whose duties include an annual review of policies and procedures for student wellness and health safety. Working with the School District nurse and the school administration, the medical advisor is a resource for student and employee health concerns.

Dr. Yale, a dual, board-certified pediatrician and pediatric hospitalist (and mother of two), sees the importance of her role for Greendale students. Through her experience she has acquired the medical knowledge to support the District and its students in this important role.

"Kids cannot thrive at school if they are not physically and mentally well," she states. "It is important to have a physician serving as the medical advisor to ensure that these needs are being met."

Dr. Yale earned a bachelor of science degree in health sciences from Marquette University and received her medical degree from Creighton University School of

Medicine. She completed her residency at Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston, where she served as chief resident during her fourth year. She has been working at Children's Wisconsin since 2018 and is a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

As a student in Greendale Schools, Dr. Yale was a member of the Poms and Soccer teams and sang in the school choir. She resides in Wauwatosa with her husband and family, and shared these memories of growing up in Greendale.

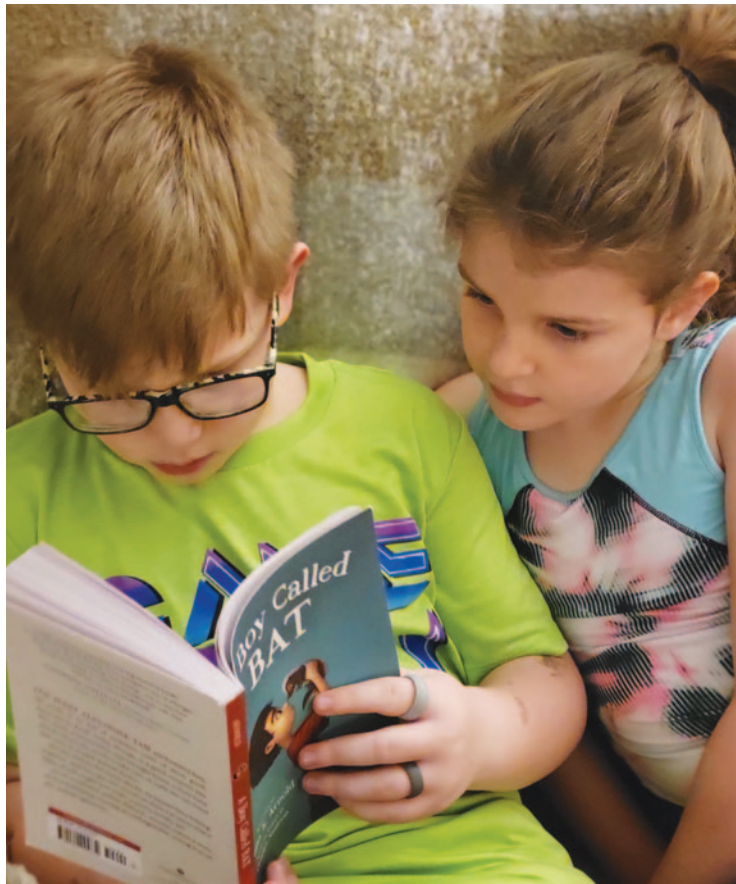
"My fondest memory of Greendale is definitely the people. Whether it be the support of teachers or fun with other students, I am so grateful for the people I met while growing up in Greendale."

Greendale Education Foundation: Unlocking the Power of Reading

It's widely understood that early development of strong reading skills is vital for young students, but few realize exactly how important and long-lasting the impact of a student's first reading experiences are. Recent studies have found that the third-grade reading level is a significant predictor of an eighth-grade reading level, and is an even better predictor of college enrollment. With that in mind, the Greendale Education Foundation is very excited to be supporting a new program at College Park Elementary, “Unlocking the Power of Reading.” Young students, when they come across an unknown word, will often try to guess, rather than read, that word. This February, the Foundation provided a \$1,000 grant for the purchase of “decodable” books, or books written to help students stop guessing difficult words, and instead “decode” the sounds in those words.

When students use their phonics skills to “decode” one word, they are more likely to apply those skills to the next difficult word they encounter. As they develop these skills, reading becomes more automatic, and students become more confident. In kindergarten through third grade, students are learning how to read; by fourth grade, students are reading for comprehension, but without

the strong foundation developed in earlier grades, comprehension will be difficult. “Unlocking the Power of Reading” and this grant aim to help provide that foundation for the student's long-term educational success.

As one College Park first-grade teacher says: “In first grade, it is our mission to engage students in an environment where they fall in love with reading through books that are too good to resist, a community of peers who read and talk about books together, and teachers who believe in them and help them develop both reading passions and reading skills.”

Since 1998, the Greendale Education Foundation has been committed to bringing together community support and resources to meet the needs of students, educators, families, and community members. Almost \$400,000 has been raised to fund learning opportunities for Greendale students and staff.

Biz Town Is Back Making Connections With Real World

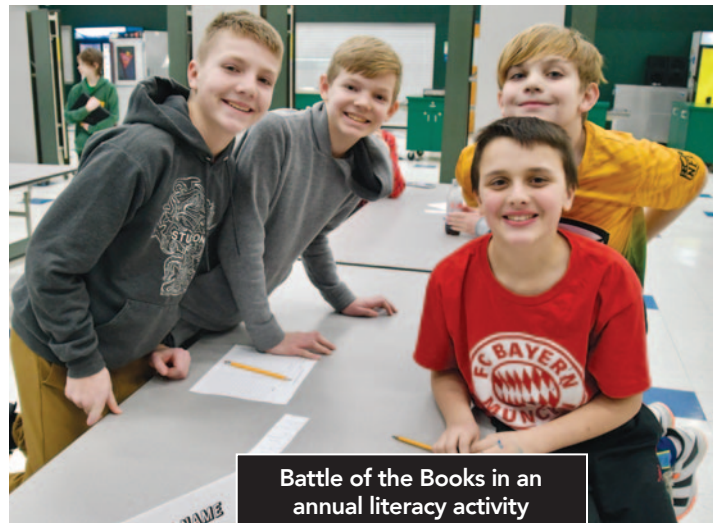
One of the field trips most looked forward to by Greendale students is the annual trip to BizTown. Each spring, fourth grade classes from all Greendale elementary schools participate in the Junior Achievement (JA) program that supports student learning on economics. The field trip is a culmination of in-class learning with a day-long visit to a simulated town. Our elementary school students operate banks, manage restaurants, write checks and vote for mayor. Students find the connections between what they learn in school and the real world.

BizTown combines financial literacy, entrepreneurship and work-readiness curriculum. Prior to the trip, students applied for jobs, and learned resume-building and interviewing skills. At BizTown, each student held a job, got paid for their work, and then could shop with the money they earned. A day at BizTown is exciting and a great start for students by developing their understanding of work and life!

Students Earn Top 10 Ranking in National, International Competition!

Competing against teams across America and the world, Greendale's Highland View fifth graders took 9th place in the U.S. in the online Arcademics Challenge! At the beginning of February, students joined the challenge, an internet program that uses games to support the learning of fundamental math skills. Once a year, classes from around the nation (and the world) "compete" for points. Greendale students had been looking forward to this day and worked hard to prepare for battle. It was a really fun way to practice those important skills.

The students were so determined to do well, that many continued to play online from home to keep the score up leading to their 9th place in the nation success. The Arcademics, the company that facilitates the challenge, sent an email to Highland View fifth grade teachers to celebrate their students' achievement, "We had more than

GMS Battle of the Books Showcases Literacy

Greendale Middle School (GMS) recently held its 2023 Battle of the Books competition. A co-curricular opportunity, students read a specific list of books and answered questions as a team during a battle session held in the cafeteria. Fifteen student teams competed for the chance to earn trophies and prizes, and a chance to represent GMS at the state-level competition.

One teacher team competed just for fun.

Words of Wisdom, a team of seventh graders, missed just one question and received 360 points. (They represented GMS in the State Battle, and placed 12th out of 147 middle school teams.)

The second place team, eighth graders in the Night Owls, scored 310 points. The third place team, IDK, a team of both seventh and eighth grade students, earned a score of 255 points.

Congratulations to all the hard-working students who took part in this year's competition.

Battle of the Books is an annual tradition in Greendale Schools. The first "Battle" at GMS was held in 2002. Over the years nearly 1,700 GMS students have participated! Greendale's elementary schools also participate in the statewide competition.



College Park Community Celebrates Literacy with All-School Read-At-Home

Parent nights and progress conferences, family celebrations, and daily homework – these are some of the ways that Greendale Schools teachers use to engage families in their students’ learning community. This spring, College Park Elementary is taking engagement one step further with an All-School Family Read-At-Home.

In an assembly in late January, students were introduced to the book, “A Boy Called Bat” by Elana K. Arnold. The story follows a young boy named Bixby Alexander Tam (aka Bat), who is an authentic, unforgettable autistic character. Through the book, students, families and staff are following him through his life, which is full of surprises, the most unexpected being a young skunk that he believes will make a terrific pet.

College Park teachers Jaime Dugan, Kate Searing and



Stephanie Uden are the staff leaders of this literacy project. “This team began planning for the Read-At-Home project this last summer,” says School Principal Michael Brock. “They have gone above and beyond to provide a comprehensive, well-developed program our students and families will

benefit from. I am extremely proud to be able to support them in the amazing work they do!”

With a generous grant from Greendale Education Foundation, every College Park family was provided with a copy of the book and a Read At Home Learning Guide to lead this learning. Families can choose to read the book together or listen to a recording of the assigned chapters read by a school staff member. Photos of families reading at home are shared through social media.

In addition to the at-home guided book discussions, each Friday students took part in book discussions with their classmates. A celebration of the school-wide read was held at the College Park PTO Dinner and Raffle on Friday, March 10, with a book trivia game. Students participating in the TRIVIA game that evening were awarded prize tickets for a special raffle basket!

“All of us have enjoyed hearing about the reading adventures students are having at home with their families through this school-wide read,” Mr. Brock adds. “We are fostering a love of reading and building community with this program. It is exciting to see both of these goals reached.”

Greendale, at just 85 years young, is at a crossroads. Preserving and sharing our history is still possible. It is not like we are Mesopotamia, after all. The '38ers – those original to the "Originals" – can still share their first-hand accounts of life in our Village during our infancy. Right now is an ideal time to get our "data ducks" in a row.

Herding that gaggle of ducks are Greendale Historical Society volunteers, giving their time, energy and evolving keyboarding skills. The Greendale Historical Society Archive Team is embracing the task of organizing our historical records and photographs so they can be digitized and shared via the Internet. Digitizing endangered paper records and photos is a big deal. It leads to a universal sharing experience, 24/7 availability, with the creation of the Greendale Digital Museum with public access – even if you live in Greendale's "G" section. The Society has earmarked donated funds for this project.

A Walk Down Memory Lane with Village Days: 1958 To The Present

Very soon, we will be excitedly anticipating the largest annual celebration in Greendale: Village Days. As we begin to prepare for this popular event, I would like to offer a collection of thoughts, memories and idle ramblings from the people associated with this much-loved celebration over the years.

For the record, the festival is NOT called, "Greendale Days." It is also not "Greenfield Days." And since it is more than 20 miles from Glendale, it surely is not "Glendale Days" either. So let's get this straight ... Say it with me: "VILLAGE DAYS." We also fully realize the event happens to fall over the week of State Fair (we are reminded of this often, so we haven't forgotten). But all joking aside, let's take a moment to look back at the who's and what's that made Village Days the (not so) little festival that could!

Village Days is Greendale's largest celebration and it has happened annually since 1939. This annual event takes place the second full weekend in August (this year August 10-13). Over the past decades, there have been parades, food, fireworks, refreshments, bands and fun for the whole family. The most important component to

Village Days, however, is the volunteers. They are the backbone and the lifeblood of the event. And for their time and talent, all organizers are eternally grateful!

Over the years, several organizations have run Village Days. I will start with the Jaycees, who took it over in the early '80s and ran it through the 1996 festival. Here are some observations from Dr. Terry Hough: "My input goes from 1986 through 1992. What an incredible few days for the Greendale residents as well as surrounding communities. The Jaycees had a huge hand in providing food, drinks, entertainment, glow necklaces and bracelets for kids, as well as running the parade. The event was originally celebrated in the Village until the early '80s when it was moved behind the High School. A huge tent was erected to protect the patrons and bands from inclement weather. Food and drink stations were managed by the Jaycees and a stage was erected for the music. We had a high striker game, a hole-in-one contest which was about a 60-yard wedge shot to the hand-built green. Prizes were awarded for closest to the pin as well as a hole-in-one. Also, who could forget the fabulous fireworks on the Saturday night of Village Days!"

I will add that skeeter beater was spread over the

surrounding foliage, and straw was laid down on the grass so people would not be ankle-deep in mud, should it rain.

Enter this article's author... Terry recruited me to join the Jaycees in 1990 when I was 24. He asked for help moving the event back to the Village. I was responsible for making that happen and the first year that it was back in the Village was 1994. However, during 1995-1996, the Jaycees fell on hard times, and I was deeply worried about our amazing festival falling by the wayside and into oblivion. Upon conclusion of the 1996 Village Days, I drew up the plans, put together a rough list of costs, and handed a red, three-ring binder to Ron Barbian, Al Sikorski and John Hermes. I remember asking them, "take care of our baby because my wife and I have a baby of our own coming in August of 1997."

From there, the GEA (Greendale Entertainment Association) was founded by seven original members, including the three gentlemen previously mentioned, as well as Mark Krueger, Greg Kornack, Cynthia Jahn and Dan Neusteadler.

This group set an excellent foundation for the uptick in quality entertainment, excellent sponsorships and Barbian's idea of the Family Entertainment Area. Each and every year, it's a trial by fire, with new ideas, new visions and new sweat equity. Some things have worked over the years and some have flopped miserably. But for every mistake or heartache, there are 100 amazing memories created from that particular year. And all along this journey, profits from the event have been given back to many local organizations – too numerous to list.

Please join us again this summer for the 2023 Village Days as we will be celebrating the 85th birthday of this amazing place we call home! We invite you to take part this year, if you can. We are always looking for volunteers, new members and new ideas to keep Village Days such a fun, vital event that brings together all of Greendale.

Exciting Opportunities To Serve Offered By Greendale Lions Club

Over the past few months, the Greendale Lions Club has been busy serving. Read on to find out more about this generous club, part of an international organization, that keeps giving back in so many ways to the Greendale community!

PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT AT HIGHLAND VIEW

In December 2022, representatives from Greendale Lions Club presented a \$2,500 check to the Greendale School District for all-abilities playground equipment at Highland View Elementary School. The all-abilities playground piece was selected by members of the Greendale School District early childhood and special education teams who advocated for a playground option that meets sensory needs by not requiring children to move up or down while using.

The School District is working on a project to install the adaptive piece of equipment and rubber play surface in the summer of 2023. The Greendale Lions Club has also committed to donating an additional \$2,500 in the third quarter of 2023 to help fund this project.

LIONS FORM NEW "LEO CLUB"

In February 2023, the Greendale Lions Club held its first-ever Leo Club meeting.

What makes a Leo? "Leadership, Experience, Opportunity." The Leo Club will provide Greendale youth (ages 12 to 18) the opportunity to appreciate the satisfaction of service, while gaining leadership skills that will last a lifetime. Greendale's Leo Club is community-based and student-run, with the help of advisors and mentors from Field

Workshop and Greendale Lions Club. Leo members as a group will choose what causes are important to them. They will then plan, organize and execute service projects or fundraisers for those causes. The Greendale Leo Club can also conduct projects/fundraisers with other Leo Clubs, Greendale Lions Club or with an outside organization.

Leo Club Fees:

General membership: \$20 annual fee (annual fee is waived for members of the leadership team).

Leadership Team: Non-Greendale resident one-time \$55, Greendale resident one-time \$40 (thanks to Greendale Schools for providing \$15 off enrollment).

Leo Club Schedule:

Currently, the Club meets twice a month, on the second (leadership team) and fourth (general membership and leadership team) Thursday from 4:30-5:30 p.m. at Field Workshop.

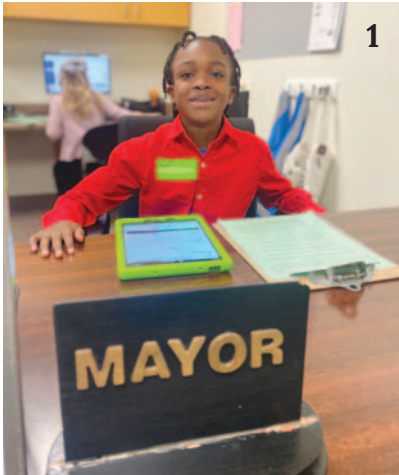

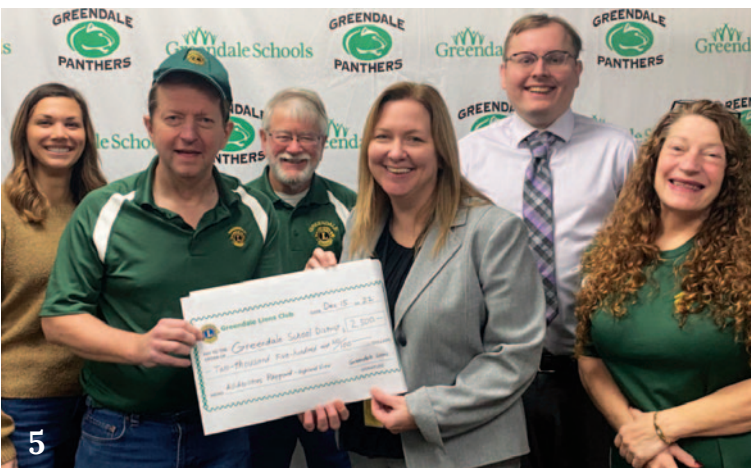
