#### **Communicable Disease**

- Highly pathogenic avian influenza (bird flu) was identified at a poultry farm in WI and has now been identified in several wild birds. <u>What to know about bird flu</u> is especially important if you handle live poultry or a sick or injured wild bird.
- Multiple reports of "stomach flu" in and around Greendale
- Viral gastroenteritis is an intestinal infection that includes signs and symptoms such as watery diarrhea, stomach cramps, nausea or vomiting, and sometimes fever. This type of illness is not actually the flu (INFLUENZA) as influenza is a respiratory (lung/breathing) virus. The flu shot will not protect you from the "stomach flu" only from influenza.

### **Chronic Disease**

- The <u>Greendale Community Robotics Club</u> is offering <u>3D printed assistive devices</u> for individuals who may need a little assistance with tasks.
- Mind Over Matter workshop started on 3/9 and is a 3-session workshop focusing on bowel and bladder health.
