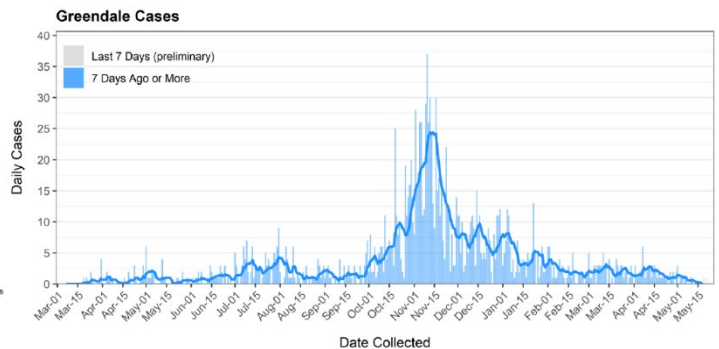
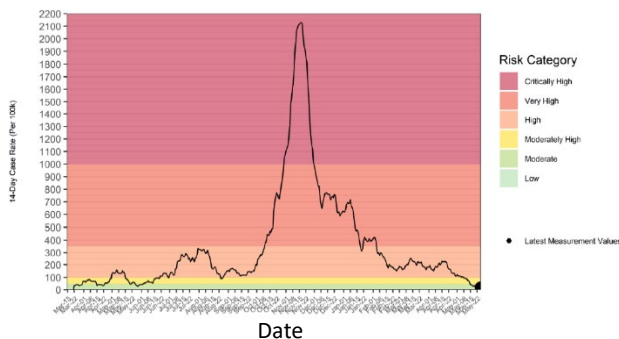
- 4/28/21 through 5/11/21: 2.9%

\*the positivity rate is the percentage of all coronavirus tests performed that are actually positive. The percent positive is a critical measure because it gives us an indication of how widespread infection is in the area where the testing is occurring and whether levels of testing are keeping up with the level of disease transmission.

### COVID-19 Vaccine

- Scaled back mass clinics as vaccination rates rose and demand declined
  - As of 5/27/21, in Greendale, 68% of adults were fully vaccinated, 75% of adults had received at least one dose, and 61% of the total population had received at least one dose
- Partnered with Hayat Pharmacy and the Greendale School District to hold vaccination clinics for students 12 years and older
- On May 10, eligibility for the Pfizer vaccine expanded to include adolescents down to 12 years of age
