- The Dementia workgroup (part of SAGE-Successful Aging in Greendale for Everyone) learned that the Greendale Health Department was selected as 1 of 4 health departments by NACCHO and the Alzheimer’s Association to participate in a “community convening” project in 2022. Staff from those national offices plan to come to Greendale and assist with a rapid strategic planning project related to dementia.
- Mental Health Presentation by MCW student-12 participants attended, including school district and area hospital staff.

#### **Community Alliance Coalition**

- The CA Teen Team had their quarterly meeting. Members selected campaign materials from [Seize the Awkward](#) to create an ad on Snap Chat. The ad will run 11/8-11/30 targeting 13-18 year old’s in the Greendale/Hales Corners area. The ad was a great success and had 97,800 impressions (views) and 740 “swipe ups” which means the viewer followed the ad to the Teen Team webpage.
- Staff are working on finalizing Year 3 work plan and contract for the Partnership for Success (PFS) grant funds. These funds will specifically be used to support community-level mental wellness activities.
- Staff attended the American Public Health Association conference (virtually)
  - Received a scholarship from the Alliance for WI Youth (AWY)
- Met with “Exit Plan” subcommittee-parent survey drafted to collect baseline info from families about whether they have an “exit plan” and if so, how they use it.
- The Coalition helped to promote National Take Back Day with the Hales Corners and Greendale Police Departments.
  - Over 80 lbs. of medications were collected the week of Take Back Day
